Sept 4

Commences with a moderate Breeze from the Westward & fine pleasant weather steering P.W. employed stowing down oil the Phips Eagle & John-Palmer in night. Middle & Latter part at noon finished stowing down oil - Lat By C.B.P 31° 13' N Long By C.L 164° 00' E

Sunday
Sept 5

Commences with a fine Breeze at P.W. & pleasant weather steering NW. Middle Lying By at 7 AM tacked to the S.W. Latter part a fine Breeze at NW & fine weather steering NW. P.W. 4 h knots the John Palmer in sight to Leeward - Lat By C.B.P 31° 31' N Long By C.L 163° 25' E

Monday
Sept 6

Commences with a fine Breeze at North & fine weather steering NW. at night hoisted Middle part to Lying By - at daylight made sail & steered NW. Latter part moderate Breeze at South & P.W. & thick cloudy weather - employed setting up Rigging - Lat By C.L 31° 50' N Long By C.L 162° 30' E

Tuesday
Sept 7

Commences with a moderate Breeze at P.W. with light rain at 1 PM spoke Phip Caladonia & N. London Young 25 months out with 200 Bbls of oil. Middle part strong Wind & thick rainy weather - Lying By - at 6 AM strong Gales sent down the flag & Mizzen top & yard. & fore & Mizzen Royal masts - Latter part much the same - Lat By C.L 32° 10' N Long By C.L 163° 00' E

Wednesday
Sept 8

Commences with a strong Wind & variable from West to NNW attended with squalls of rain - Lying By under short sail. Middle - Latter part moderate Wind at NNE & clearing with a high swell running - employed fitting Rigging &c - Lat By C.B.P 32° 00' N Long By C.L 163° 25' E

Thursday
Sept 9

Commences with a moderate Breeze at NE & cloudy weather steering NE under short sail. Middle to Lying By - at daylight made sail & steered to the Westward - Lat By C.B.P 31° 32' N Long By C.L 163° 00' E

Friday
Sept 10

Commences with a strong Breeze from the NW & thick heavy weather steering W.P.W. at 2 PM saw a school of sperm Whales lowered our Boats & struck & killed a 30 Pbl Whale - at 6 PM took him to the Phip. Middle part strong Wind & thick squally weather with a rough sea running - at daylight wore ship & began cutting - at 9 AM finished - Lat By C.B.P 31° 22' N Long By C.L 162° 50' E

Saturday
Sept 11

Commences with a strong Wind at NW & cloudy with a high swell from the Northward - employed Burying - at 4 PM spoke Phip Kingdon & Keenman with 100 Bbls of oil - Middle part calm - at 8 AM saw a school of Whales lowered our Boats in pursuit of them - Latter part light wind at noon the Boats still in pursuit of the Whales - Lat By C.B.P 31° 42' N Long By C.L 162° 30' E
