

Saturday
Dec 4th During these 24 hours moderate Breezes & variable employed getting off Potatoes Yams & Water & Boats crew on shore at liberty

Sunday
Dec 5th During these 24 hours light Wind & variable employed getting ready for sea Mowies

Monday
Dec 6th First 8 middle part calm pleasant weather - at daylight a light Breeze from the northward hove up our anchor found it foul let go the Starboard anchor while we cleared the ship at 11 AM took our anchor - at 11 AM made sail for Woahoo
so ends

Tuesday
Dec 7th Commences with light trades & fine weather steering West by N down the passage between Morotoi & Raimi at 6 PM the West part of Morotoi bore North Dist 2 leagues shortened sail & steered WNW at 9 AM squally hove to off Diamond Head. Latter part calm.
so ends

Wednesday
Dec 8th Commences with a light air PE & cloudy at 1 PM put 3 Boats ahead & towed the ship towards Woahoo Harbor at 2 PM the Pilot came on Board at 4 PM came to anchor in Woahoo Harbor. Middle part calm - Latter part Light Wind from the NW employed moving ship & getting ready to unlash the rudder

Thursday
Dec 9th Commences with a moderate Wind from the NW & cloudy with light rain at 2 PM unlash the Rudder & took it on deck to examine if the Head being cracked. Breeze
Latter part Moderate Wind from the NW with squalls of rain

Friday
Dec 10th Commences with light squalls of Wind from the Westward attended with showers of rain. Latter part clear weather the Blacksmith & Carpenter employed fitting the Rudder - put J.W. Coffin in the consul's hands & Woahoo on account of ill health

Saturday
Dec 11th First part strong Wind at NW & clear weather employed fitting the Rudder & various other jobs at 9 AM hung the Rudder - so ends

Sunday
Dec 12th During these 24 hours Light air & pleasant weather
so ends

Monday
Dec 13th During these 24 hours fine pleasant weather employed getting off Water & Blacking the Bends - the Carpenter finished the Rudder at noon sound

Tuesday
Dec 14th Fine weather all hands employed setting up Rigging getting off Water & getting Ready for sea - Woahoo

Wednesday
Dec 15th First part Light trades & fine weather employed getting Ready for sea at 6 AM unmoored ship & took our anchor to proceed to sea the Wind being to light & baffling dropped the anchor again

Thursday
Dec 16th Middle part strong trades at 4 AM began to get our anchor at 9 AM made first part calm sail & got over the Bar under double reef - at 11 AM discharged the pilot

Friday
Dec 17th Commences with strong trades at ENE & cloudy steering PE by N at 5 PM Calm at 5 PM the South part of Woahoo Bore SSE Dist 6 leagues - Middle & Latter part Calm Woahoo in sight
