Friday

June 17<sup>th</sup> Commences with a light Breeze & fine  
weather steering to the WNW. saw in  
sight. Lat By BR 30 02 N  
Long By AC 164 00 E

Saturday

June 18<sup>th</sup> Commences with a moderate Breeze at  
PM & pleasant weather steering WNW  
a sail in sight. Middle D.  
Latter part a fine Breeze at PM &  
thick foggy weather steering to the WNW  
Lat By AC 31 00 N  
Long By AC 163 30

Sunday

June 19<sup>th</sup> Commences with a moderate Wind at  
PM & thick foggy weather steering  
to the Westward at 5 PM spoke Ship  
George & Susan of N Bedford. Gave over  
18 months out with 800 Blk - Oil  
Middle D. under Port sail  
Latter part a strong Wind at PM & thick  
cloudy weather headed to the SSE  
in company with the George & Susan  
Lat By BR 31 00 N  
Long By Chr 162 57

Monday  
June 20<sup>th</sup>

Commences with strong Wind at PM & thick  
squally foggy weather in company with  
the George & Susan. at 4 PM carried away  
the crotchets yard it being rotten.  
Middle D.  
Latter part calm cloudy weather, the George  
& Susan in sight - fitted another crotchets yard -  
& got it a aft - Lat By BR 30 57 N  
Long By AC 162 57 E

Tuesday

June 21<sup>st</sup> Commences with a light Breeze at PM  
& thick cloudy weather at 1 PM saw 4  
Large Whales first with all four Boats chased  
till dark but could not get near them  
Middle D. Latter part strong Wind at PM  
& thick hazy weather steering by the Wind  
to the Portward - Lat By BR 30 58 N  
Long By AC 162 30

Wednesday

June 22<sup>nd</sup> During these 24 hours strong Wind at PM  
& thick cloudy weather with a rough sea  
running steering by the Wind W - under  
Double reef Topsails. Lat By BR 30 11 N  
Long By Chr 163 50

Thursday

June 23<sup>rd</sup> Commences with a strong Breeze at PM  
& thick hazy weather steering by the Wind  
W at 2 PM saw a Whale Break -  
at 4 PM saw 3 Large Whales - at 6 PM  
Landed our Boats. Spoke a Large Whale  
with Boats. Kell her she went down & took two  
lines - at dark came on Board  
Middle D. - tacked Ship every two hours  
in hopes to find the Whale the next day  
Latter part light air - the Boats chasing Whales  
two Ships in sight - Lat By AC 31 19 N  
Long By AC 163 00
