 Middle Do - at daylight began cutting  
 the Head employed Barling & C -  
 at 10 AM saw 3 Large Whales put off  
 in pursuit of them, Lat By a C 30-22 N  
 Long By a C 163-40 E

Saturday Commences with a light Wind & cloudy  
 June 25th weather at 1 PM struck & killed a large  
 Whale at 4 PM took him to the Ship  
 & cut off the Head -  
 Middle Part squally with rain  
 at daylight began cutting at noon  
 finished - saw nine sail of Ships;  
 Lat By a C 30-11 N  
 Long By a C 164-00 E

Sunday Commences with a strong Wind at  
 June 26th PM & fine weather - employed Barling  
 at 1 PM spoke Ship Ann, of Nantuck  
 Brayton 13 months out with 675 Bbls  
 Middle & Little Do employed Barling  
 Lat By a C 29-01 N  
 Long By a C 164-50 E

Monday Commences with a moderate Wind at  
 June 27th PM & cloudy employed Barling saw two  
 ships at 2 PM began with rain  
 at 9 PM finished Barling -  
 Latter part a moderate Wind at WPNW  
 steering by the Wind NW - Lat By a C 30-10 N  
 Long By a C 163-00 E

Tuesday Commences with a light Breeze at WPNW & fine  
 June 28th pleasant weather steering by the Wind NW  
 employed Barling out between decks to get  
 out 130 B & C  
 Middle & Latter part much the same - saw a sail  
 to the SE - Lat By a C 30-15 N  
 Long By a C 163-00 E

Wednesday Commences with a moderate Breeze from  
 June 29th PM to WPNW & hazy weather steering by  
 the Wind to the southward - employed Barling  
 taking out the after Bolt Middle Do  
 Latter part a moderate Breeze at WPNW  
 & hazy weather steering to the Westward  
 employed stowing down oil -  
 Lat By a C 29-52 N  
 Long By a C 162-50 E

Thursday Commences with a light Breeze at WPNW &  
 June 30th hazy weather steering to the Westward  
 employed stowing down oil, saw 3 ships  
 Middle Do steering west under short sail  
 at 6 AM saw a school of Large Whales at  
 7 Landed our Board & shabba till noon  
 but could not get near them -  
 & Ships in sight Lat By a C 30-22 N  
 Long By a C 162-12 E

Friday Commences with a moderate Breeze at WPNW  
 July 1st & fine weather steering by the Wind NE  
 at 4 PM took to the Westward  
 Middle Do - Latter part strong Wind at PM &  
 WPNW & cloudy under short sail put 3  
 pipes of Oil between decks at 10 PM spoke  
 Ship Ann of Nantuck 11 months  
 out with 500 Bbls Lat By a C 30-20 N  
 Long By a C 162-00 E
