

Remarks On Board Bark Montezuma 1852
Sunday February 22. 1852

Comences with brisk trades from S & E steering by the wind to S & W at 3 PM took in the foretopgallant sail and gafftopsail middle part the same last moderate breezes set the fore topgallant sail fly jib and gafftopsail so ends lat

lat by Chron 26 05 S long by Chron 26 00 W
23 Monday February 23. 1852
Comences fine with moderate trades steering by the wind under all sail to S and west middle and last part the same to work on the riggin heading to South and west so ends lat 12 02 S long by Chron 26 51 W

24 Tuesday February 24. 1852
Comences fine with light trades steering by the wind under all sail at 1 PM took in the fore topgallant sail to fit the riggin at 6 PM set it again middle and fore at 1 o'clock 30 minutes AM took in the foretopgallant sail fly jib and gafftopsail last brisk breezes and fine to work braking out the main hatch for water and sugar so ends lat by Chron 14 12 S
25 Wednesday February 25. 1852
Comences fine with brisk breezes from S & E steering by the wind the watch to work stowing away iron hoops at 6 PM set the foretopgallant sail fly jib and gafftopsail heading to the S and Westward middle brisk breezes from S & E heading S by the wind last the same at 8 AM sent the fore topsail down to repair it the watch employed mending it so ends lat by Chron 16 36 S South long by Chron 27 06 W

26 Thursday February 26. 1852
Comences fine with moderate breezes from S & E steered by the wind to the S the watch to work mending the foretopsail at 4 PM finished and bent it again middle part the same last brisk breezes from E by N steering by the wind to the S and E the watch to work on riggin so ends lat by Chron 18 09 S long by Chron 26 33 W

27 Friday February 27. 1852
Comences fine with brisk breezes from E by N steering by the wind under all sail heading to the S and East to work setting up the bobstays middle the same at 7 AM called all hands and commenced braking out the fore hatch and to cooper the bread and varnish the deck frame strongbreeses took in the light sails and halled up the main sail so ends lat 20 13 S long 26 05 W

Remarks On Board Bark Montezuma 1852
Saturday February 28. 1852

Comences with brisk breezes from S & E steering by the wind to the South all hands employed braking out bread and coopering it and stowing it back again at sunset set the main sail and maintopsail middle strong breezes last moderate took in the main topgallant sail and halled up the main sail all hands employed braking out the bread and coopering it and varnishing the deck frame so ends lat by Chron 22 02 S long by Chron 25 30 W

29 Sunday February 29. 1852
Comences with moderate breezes from S & E steering by the wind to the South and East all hands employed stowing back the bread and pushing water out of the wind filling it with salt at 2 PM set the main sail and maintopsail middle the same last light breezes from S and East set all sail so ends lat by Chron 23 47 S long by Chron 24 50 W

1852 March the First

Comences fine with light breezes from E by S steering by the wind to the S and E under all sail in sight to the windward middle and last light are from E N & steering by the wind under all sail all hands employed braking out bread and flower and coopering it and varnishing the deck so ends lat 24 51 S long by Chron 24 00 W

2 Monday March the 2. 1852
Comences fine with light are from E N & steering by the wind under all sail heading to the S & E all hands to work stowing back the flour and bread at 5 PM the vessel from N by E to N W steered S & E had a light squall of rain at dark finished stowing off the after hatch middle and last part Cabin all hands employed sitting up riggin so ends lat by Chron 25 10 S long 25 46 W

3 Tuesday March the 3. 1852
Comences fine and calm all hands employed sitting up riggin middle & last light are from various ways steering S & E all hands employed sitting up riggin so ends lat by Chron 25 24 S long by Chron 25 56 W
