

Bark Montezuma Bound Home
the Saturday March 20 1852

20 Commences fine with light trades from S & steering N by W under all sail nothing doing save working ship middle square at 2 AM took in the studding sail at sunrise set them again light breeze from S & steering N by W all hands employed braking out the main hatch for water so ends

the Sunday March 21 1852

21 Commences calm with rain squalls and light breeze from various ways took in the studding sails at 5 PM took a brisk breeze from the S and Eastward steered N by W under all sail middle and last the same steering N by W under all sail at 8 AM set black fish toward the boats but without success at half past 9 AM took up the boats and set the fore topmast studding sail so ends lat by Ob 00 30 S long by Chr 57 40

the Monday March 22 1852

22 Commences with light winds from N & E by S & steering N by W under all sail middle and last part light breezes from N & E steering by the wind to the N N W under all sail at 6 AM took in the maintop galeent sail so ends lat by Ob 00 34 N long by Chr 38 29

the Tuesday March 23 1852

23 Commences fine with brisk breezes from N & E steering by the wind under all sail to the N N W at 5 PM cept off N W by N half N middle the same last brisk breezes steering by the wind heading N W by N under all sail so ends lat 2 14 S long by Chr 39 50 W

the Wednesday March 24 1852

24 Commences with brisk trades from N N E & steering by the wind under all sail heading N W by N middle and last the same at 9 AM took in the gaff topsail at 5 took in the fly jib the gye parted at 6 set the gaff topsail again at 9 got the gye fitted and set up and set the jib again at 10 set the main topmast studding sail and steered N W by N so ends lat lat by Obs 04 03 N

the Thursday March 25 1852

25 Commences with brisk trades from N & E under all sail steering N W by N at 5 PM the foretopmast studding sail tack black strap parted halled down the studding sail and strapped the block again at 4 PM set the studding sail again and halled down the fly jib and fore top galeent sail and set up the backstays and set them again middle and last part the same nothing doing save working ship so ends lat 06 26 N long 44 42 W

the Friday March 26 1852

26 Commences with brisk trades from N & E steering N W by N by Compass at 3 PM took in the maintop galeent studding sail the wind halling to the Northward middle and last part the same steering N W by N by Compass to wash mending the fore spencers so ends lat by Ob 08 29 N long by Chr 46 52

the Saturday March 27 1852

27 Commences with brisk trades from N & E steering N W by N by Compass under all sail middle and last the same under all sail steering N W by N by Compass so ends lat by Ob 11 04 N long by Chron 49 08 W

the Sunday March 28 1852

28 Commences with moderate trades from N & E steering N W by N under all sail at 2 PM set the lower studding sail on the misermast for a crackle sail middle and last part light winds from N & E steering N W by N under all sail so ends lat by Ob 12 34 N long 50 36 W

the Monday March 29 1852

29 Commences with light breeze from N & E steering N W by N under all sail middle and last part the same light breeze from N & E steering N W by N under all sail ~~the watch~~ employed mending the main sail so ends lat by Act 10 30 N long by Chron 51 32 W
