the Tuesday March 30 1852

30 Commences fine with light airs from NNE steering NW by N under all sail a 30 min Am bent the mainsail and set it again middle part colour last light airs from NNE steering by the wind under all sail Lat by Ob 14 03 N long by Ch 52.10 21 W

the Wednesday March 31 1852

31 Commences with light airs from NN steering by the wind to the NNE under all sail middle and last part moderate breezes heading NW by N so ends lat 15.25 N Long 54.02 W

the April the 1 1852

1 Thursday Commences with moderate breezes from NNE steering NW by N under all sail broke out a barrell of Pork and one of beef middle and last brisk breezes from NNE steering NW by N under all sail so several humpbacks so ends lat by Ob 17.21 N long 55.48 W

the Friday April the 2 1852

2 Commences with strong breezes from NNE steering NW by N under all sail middle and last part strong breeze from NNE by E steering NW by W to work setting new foot roapes to the fore yard so ends lat by Ob 19.28 N long by Ob 57.58 W

the Saturday April the 3 1852

3 Commences with strong breezes from ENE steering NW by N by compass the under all sail middle and last the wind from E steering NW by N under all sail so ends lat by Ob 21.22 N long 59.34 W

the Sunday April the 4 1852

4 Commences fine with light airs from ENE to NNE steering NW by N under all sail middle and last the same struck and got a porpoise one sail in sight so ends lat by Ob 22.14 N long by Chron 60.19 W

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the Monday April 5 1852

5 Commences fine with Calmes and light Airs from NE steering NW by N under all sail middle and last light airs 2 sails in sight so ends lat 22.46 N Long 60.42 W

the Tuesday April 6 1852

6 Commences fine with light airs from NE steering NW by W at 2 PM the wind shifted to SW took in the studding sails and Braced round and steered NW by W the above mentioned sails in sight so humpbacks broke out the fore hatch for flower and water middle Calm last light breezes from SW steering NNE to work setting up the Lib gyes so ends lat 23.44 N Long 60.06 W

the Wednesday April 7 1852

7 Commences with moderate breezes from SW steering NNE under all sail one sail in sight middle and last strong breezes from WSW steering NW by N so several sails set the studding sail so ends lat 25.54 N Long 62.14 W

the Thursday April 8 1852

8 Commences with strong breezes from WSW under all sail steering NW by N middle part the wind halled to the NE backed ship steered NW half N under all sail so one sail so ends lat 27.25 N long 63.23 W

the Friday April 9 1852

9 Commences with strong winds from NNE by E steering NW half N under all sail one sail in sight set the fore and main topmast studding sail middle and latter part fresh breezes from the SW so ends lat by Ob 29.25 N long by Chron 65.10 Long by Chron 65.06 W

the Saturday April 10 1852

10 Commences with brisk breezes from the SW steering NW at 3 PM the wind halled to the W with squalls of rain took in studding sails middle and latter the wind NW steering to NE By the wind so ends lat by Ob 31.06 N long by Chron 65.11 W
