the Sunday April 11 1852

11 Commences with light breezes from N.W. steering to the West by the wind middle and latter part Calmes with light ares heading N by S by the wind at 9 AM tacked to the N and E so ends
latt by Ob 30.48 N Long 66.12 W

the Monday April 12 1852

12 Commences fine with Calmes and light ares from the N and W steering by the wind to the N.W. & middle Calm last light breezes the South steering N.W. so a schooner that had lost her mainmast steering E N E so ends latt 31.12 N Long 66.18 W

the Tuesday April 13 1852

13 Commences with brisk breezes from the Southward steering N.W. by Compass at 2 PM fast & big steering to the Eastward and exchanged longtides with the to sea how they compared middle and last strong gails from S.W. steering N.W. at 3 AM she made a heavy haul and carried away the starboard boat and forward dory and the spars over the stern took in all sail and luffed two heading N.W. by W so ends latt 33.08 N Long 67.51 W

the Wednesday April 14 1852

14 Commences with strong gales from S.W. to N.W. laying 18 heading to North at 4 PM set close reefed main topsails and took in the waist boat and turned her up over the桁works middle the same last the wind abated set the fore the clue of the main topsail so ends latt 33.31 N Long 67.32 W

the Thursday April 15 1852

15 Commences with heavy gales from the N.W. steering by the wind to the N and E under close reefed main topsail foresail fore and main spensers and fore topmast standsails middle part moderated at 4 AM set the fore topsail fore & spensers at 6 AM set the mainsail shook the reefs out of the topsails set the main topgallant sail the wind from the South at 10 AM took in the main topgallant sail at 12 Close reefed the topsails took in the Boarses blowing heavy steering N.W. half W so ends

the Friday April 16 1852

16 Commences with heavy Gales from South steering N.W. half W at 2 PM luffed too beating so rugged that we could not run took in the foretopsail and set the spensers at 5 PM a heavy sea boarded her and stove the cooks galls and broke the stove at 6 PM good winged the main topsail and battered down the hatches and got every thing snug for the night middle the same at 8 AM the wind dyed away latter part fresh breezes from the N.W. at 5 AM wore ship heading S.W. by W so ends latt 34.20 N Long by Chron 68.06

the Saturday April 17 1852

17 Commences with fresh breezes from the N.W. heading S.W. by W at 4 PM reefed the topsails middle part moderate latter part light ares from the S.E. steering N.W. by W all sail set broke out for water so one sail so a candle adrift very little gulf we got out a new mainsail so ends latt by O 33.55 Long by Chron 68.41

the Sunday April 18 1852

18 Commences with light ares from S.E. steering N.W. by W bent the New Mainsail middle and last strong winds steering N.W. by W at 3 PM took in the main topgallant sail at dusk reefed the fore topsail at day light sent the fore topgallant yard down at 7 Close reefed the main topsail and fished the fore at 10 AM fished the foresail and luffed to heading to the N.E. the wind from S.E. and sent down the main topgallant yard so ends latt 35.08 N Long by Act 70.48

the Monday April 19 1852

19 Commences with strong gales from S.E. laying too under Close reefed main topsail and spensers heading to N Eastward at 6 PM luffed off and steared N.W. by W at 11 PM luffed to the wind halled to the S and W heading to the Eastward at 5 AM wore ship and cepit her of her coars again at 7 AM wore ship and luffed to heading S.E. the wind from S.W. so ends latt 35.29 N Long by Chron 71.15 W
