by N. At 8 P.M. wore Ship, Heading S.E.

Friday Jan 8th
Light wind from S and fair
weather, At 1 P.M. took ship, In the morning
set all sail, Heading N.W. & S.W. & S.W., Saw
Cape Horn as we passed it, Green water, Saw
2 ships steering to the S.E. Saw a group of porpoises
by At 6 P.M. passed the Diego Rocks one
mile to the North of them, They are small
islands, green on top of them and covered
with birds, a number of small rocks near
the big ones, Very smooth and fine weather
for Cape Horn, Refined my Chronometer by the
rocks, killed 1 Pigeon.

Saturday Jan 9th

Commenced with a calm, In the
morning Diego Rocks Barring E & S. Instant 10 P.M.
At 6 P.M. took a breeze from S.W. and blew
on, Steered N.W. & P.S. At 10 P.M. blow strong and
rainy, took in the gallant sails, Two ships
passed us steering to the Eastward, At 3 P.M.
closed reefed the topsails and reefed the courses
and took in the sails, thick rain storm, At 6
P.M. moderated, and wind hauled to the Westward
during the fore noon green water, the after
noon blue water, So ended this day Heading
S.W. & S. Carrying close reefed topsails and courses.

Sunday Jan 10th

Strong wind from N.W. to W. and
Chalk Squally, fair weather between squalls, Heading
S.W. & S.W., First part of the day carrying whole
topsails, At 12 P.M. passed a barge to the windward
of us, the under close reefed topsails and courses
furled, Latter part of the day carrying double reefed
topsails and courses, Blue water, Saw some killers
and a shoal of porpoises, Bill is much better
The barometer is off 1 inch, Sick, We have done first
rate the last three days in working to the Westward
If the wind would haul to the South, we could make
a good plan to the Westward, I think it's
a good plan to keep well in to the land to work
to the Westward, A westerly wind here gener-
ally hauls to the South, then dies away then
breezes up from the North with rain, At 11 P.M.
wore ship, Heading S.W.

Lat 57, 32 Long 73, 00

Monday Jan 11th

Commenced with strong wind from
N.W. and squally, Heading S.W. At 4 P.M. wore ship, Head-
ing S.W. & S. wind moderate, set all sail, At 8
P.M. up heavy wind S.W., Heading N.W. & S.W., At 10
P.M. away calm, A ship in sight 3 miles to the
S.W. of us, the whole ship, At 2 P.M. took a fresh
wind from S.W. Heading N.W. & S.W. Carrying all sail
with a head beat sea, At 6 P.M. headed off to S.W.
by W. and Northward, Barometer has been very low
but rising again, Saw plenty of porpoises and
caught one.
