

Wednesday March 31st

Light airs from N to N.E. and Calm, Heading from N.W. to S.W. Pleasant weather, Repaired the main topgallant Sail and bent it again. Saw nothing but birds, Blacksmith making Jags horns, Carpenter made a lash track to lash the minceing tubs too.

Thursday April 1st

Fresh breeze from N.W. to S.W. and fine weather, Steering N.W. Carrying all sail, Saw nothing but birds, Overhauled our Potatoes and Stalwed them below, about 25 lbs in all. Knocked the hoghouse down, The water gray cooler.

Friday April 2nd

Commences with moderate wind from S.E. and fine weather, Steering N.W. Carrying all sail, At 12 M wind came out of the N.W. with rain, took in the gallant Sails. Heading N.E. At 4 P.M. wore ship, Heading N.W. Cleared off fine weather, Set the gallant Sails, Unbent the old flying Sails and bent a good one, Sent aloft the Cutting Tendants, Saw 2 Finches.

Saturday April 3rd

Light wind from N.W. to S.W. and very pleasant weather, Heading from N. to S.W. all sail set. Employed in repairing the main topgallant and staysail, Built a platform for the iron works, took down the turning lathe.

Sunday April 4th

Fresh breeze from S.E. to S.W. At 5 P.M. hauled to S.W. fine weather Steering N.W. by N. Carrying all sail, Saw some Finches.

Monday April 5th

Fresh wind from W to N.W. The first part of the Day, latter part fresh from N. and huffed weather, first part heading from N.W. to S.W. Latter heading N.W. Carrying all sail, Saw Black fish 3 times through the Day and lowered for them, Did not get hold but one, Dressed from him, Saw plenty of Red Brit or whale feeders on the surface of the water, Bent a good main topsail.

Tuesday April 6th

Commences with fresh breezes from N.E. to S.E. and raining, Steering N.W. by N. Carrying all sail, Latter part wind checked in to the N.E. and blowed a fresh keefed the topsails, At 4 P.M. wind hauled to N. and cleared off. Set all sail, wind light. At 5 Light airs from N.W. were ship heading N.W. Run through grate Deal of Red whale feeders, Saw a gam of Hils.

Wednesday April 7th

Commences with a gale from N.W. Colled all hands and shortened sail, and hove too under a close reefed main topsail heading N. In the morning better weather Set all sail, Light wind from N.W. by W, Unbent the fore topsail and bent a better one.
