Thursday April 15th

Light variable wind from
N.E. to N. and fine smooth water, Shy over Cast
Carrying all sail, trying to make to the North, Saw
a number of Finbacks, Put the bowboat out,
hauled more whale lines for the Ice, building boxes
in the boats for line.

Light wind from N to N.W. and
fine weather, Shy over Cast, Carrying all sail
trying to get to the N. W. heading from E.N.E. to

bearing E by S distant 30 mile and in sight.

calm, and very fine weather, Bent a fore

Carrying Studing sails, Saw a Finback and some

fine weather, Shy over Cast, Steering N by E & S by E
Carrying Studing sails, Saw nothing through the
day, Roped the stove up in the Cabin

Tuesday April 20th

Fresh breeze from S.E. and S.
and a thick snow storm all day, Steering
N by E part of the day, the other part Steering N
Carrying Studing sails and Rops, Saw a Finback,
thick green water, We expect to come up
to ice every moment, The Deck and Boats are
covered with sleet and snow, We find it
very comfortable sitting by a warm Cabin
stove, Some of our coils of whale line has 3 shots, 70 fathoms
in a shot, The Lat 46, 06, 53, 46 Long 6, 03, 15, 4
other coils 2 shots, 100 fathoms in a shot 15, 3, 20
We have got coiled in each boat 450 and 500 fathoms
my of line At 9 P.M. Shortened sail and laid aback

Wednesday April 21st

Light wind from N.W. & N.
heading to the Northward by the wind, mostly on
the Starboard tack. At 12 M. Spoke Ship Mon
tack of Sag Harbor, Capt French, Cleary At
3 P.M. Came to the Ice, tacked and stood to
the Eastward, ice breaks heavy to the N.W.
At sundown Shortened sail and stood to the E
S.E.
