

Saturday May 29th

Fresh breeze from S.W
and fine weather, Carrying out sail beating
across to the S.W. and the W. along the ice
Saw 6 Bowheads working to the N.E.W. and in and out
the ice, 3 Ships backing and saw 2 Cutters, 11 Sail
in sight, working to the W. The ice has broke off
from the northern ice and I think we shall find
clear water nearly to the land to the W. Spoke
Ship tenacious, backing, reports seeing plenty of
a hole about here, & very green water. At 5 P.M.
Shortened sail, took a breeze from N.E.

Sunday Mar 30th

Light variable wind and Calm.
All Sail Set working to the S.W. Saw a number
of whales in the Morning and Chased, Saw a Ship
take one, about 20 Sail in Sight to the S.E.
3 Bailing, Some Scattering Ice, Foggy part of fore
noon, Latter part of the Day Clear, Saw a Dozen whale
working to the S.W, Sent the Boats in to the sea, they
Saw several whales and Batted at one, At 7 P.M.
Took a fresh breeze from S.E, Shortened Sail
and Stood on by the wind

Monday May 31st

Moderate wind from W & N to W & S.W.
and fine weather, first part of The Day we were in
to the H to the main body of Ice Saw 3 Whales
swimming to the S.E.W., & Sail in sight 3 Boiling
At 2 P.M., thinking it no other Gull whaling about here,
we set all sail and commenced beating to the W.S.W.
in clear water, betwixt the H and S Body of Ice, got
land in company of 10 whales.

Tuesday June 1st

D) Commences with light wind from W & W. Working to the S W. Carrying all sail. In the morning saw a whale still struck him on the Iron Bow. Saw 2 other whales working to the W, & sail in sight. Clear water to the W and S. to the East, At dusk shortened sail for the night. Carpenter has finished 2 Davit heads.

Wednesday June 29

Strong wind from S.E. to E. E
first part the Day Clear, In the Morning hauled
the Ship out of the Ice, Set Main top yellow sail
and run to the S.E. along the Ice, At 10 AM
Saw a whale, Lowered and got close on to him
Bk Marimeac Came close by and gave aback the
hailing, Latter part of the Day Beating to the S.E.
in Cuttinging Cakes of Ice, & Sail in Sight part
of them Steering to the S.W. and port to the S.E.
Finally all Steered to the S.W, Ice going a way
fast At 4 PM thick fog, Close reefed
the top sails and laid aback

Thursday June 3^d

Commenced with fresh wind from
SSE and some rain, Reading S.W. Carrying all Sail,
At 11 fell game, with Whip South Seaman of air Lar-
sen, Coft, Norton and BK Daniel Wood, At 4
Bell came up to see, saw 4 Whale, the South Seaman
en got one, 2 more sail in sight. At 8 P.M. Short-
ened Sail for the Night and laid aback along the Ice
