Moderate wind from S and thick foggy during the forenoon, At 1 P.M. cleared up fine weather, 7 Sail in sight, and Sonos Island in sight to the S. Chas Phelps to the N. and with 5th American and Shot a Mess of Ducks, Collecting Ice around

Saturday June 12th

Fresh breeze from S.W. and fine weather, Heading S.E. by S. Carrying all Sail, 3 Ships in Company. All Sonos Island in sight to the W.S.W. and Ice in sight to the S.W. of us, Saw a number of Pinbacks, Spoke the Chas Phelps, Took the Larboard Boat on Deck and repaired her

Sunday June 13th

Strong wind from S.W. and a thick foggy, very strong current, Carrying all Sail, Heading W. by S. At 6 P.M. foggy clear saw plenty of Pinbacks, Side kippers and birds feeding on the water, Saw nothing of the Ships accompanying

Monday June 14th

Light wind from S and thick foggy all Day, Stood upon opposite tack part the night through the Day Steered W. by S. and W. by S. Carrying Main top gallant Sail, At 5 P.M. wind from E. Came too on the Larboard tack with the Headgards aback, In the morning blue water, At 10 P.M. thick green water,

Tuesday June 15th

Light wind from S.E. and a thick foggy all Day, Laying aback all Day with the Headgards, Dark green water, with floating green and sea weeds and birds feathers on the surface of the water Heading from S.W. to W.S.W.

Wednesday June 16th

Fresh wind from S and thick foggy most the time, First part of the Day Steered to the W. Carrying all Sail, Saw nothing but Pinbacks, Latter part of the Day Steered to the S.E. Carrying all Sail, Plenty of tide kippers,

Thursday June 17th

Fresh wind from S.E. the first part of the Day, Laid aback through the night in the morning, Steered N.E. by E. Under whole topsails, At 9 P.M. came up to scattering ice and stood off and on it, thick foggy. At 6 P.M. foggy let some. Saw 2 Bowheads close by the ice struck one and lost 4 shots of line by the ice and sunk the boat bailed her out and all came to the ship, To end this Day Hoping to get a whale on the morrow

Friday June 18th

Light air from E to S. 14° 30' and thick foggy all Day, Stood in to the ice in the morning and laid aback, At 12 P.M. the ice closed us in, We worked to the N and got in to very close ice, Largest I ever saw in this sea, Crew employed in shoving the ship off the ice with poles, Heading to N.E. by W. trying to get out the ice
