

Here from South West Bay with Doo Mh.
Capt Kinworthy came aboard. Saw plenty of whale
fish, Washington Head barring off distant 8 mile

Thursday Sept 16 D^y

First port fresh breeze from N
and fine weather, sent off 4 boats a whaling, saw
about 12 whale up Fairport Bay, but not so white as they
have been, & 2 whale taken, Latter part of the day
light cut in our whale Employed in boiling, blubber
beer room full of blubber

Friday Sept 17 D

3 boats off whaling, Saw quite plenty of whales up bay near the Sandspit, Got a whale, keeling bay and took the whale along side and anchored 8 mile from the Sandspit in 10 fathoms water and clay bottom
4 whales taken to bay, 5 ships in Tailors bay, Employed in sailing, broke the fore pole and for Cabin, The Delaware got a whale

Saturday Sept 18th

Light breeze from NW and calm
and fine warm weather. Sent off 2 boats whaling
Saw about 6 whales, Caten saw whale, Employed in
bailing, Capt Kimworthy came on board, Mr Benjamin
Saunders and the passage in the Harbor at the Head
of Sailors Bay, found from 4 to 6 fathoms water clay
bottom

Sunday Sept 19

Light NW wind and fine weather
Sent 1 boat off whaling, Saw no whales in the bay
Stowed down 140 bbls of oil, Employed in sailing; Capt
Allen on the Lempest went in to Salar Harbor and
sounded it out and reports it being a good harbor anchorage

From 4 to 6 fathoms water, hard Sand bottom, give the North Sand Spit a good beating for the water is shall off some ways.

Monday Sept 20th

Monday Sept 20th
Light wind from SW and fine weather
in the morning took our anchor in Sailors Bay
and run over to Murkys Bay. Saw no whales
in Sailors Bay, but saw 15 half way from Washing-
ton head to Totters Head. Dorted at one Delaware
and the largest encompassing. Spoke BK Enclave
900 bbl, spoke ship Maria Macey 500 bbl
About 15 sail in sight and most all sailing

Tuesday Sept 21st C

Strong wind from S.W. and Clear
weather, in the morning took the Anchor and stood
backwards and forwards, betwixt Washington and
Newbern Head, Saw 30 whale, Chast, Saw one
taken, 14 Sail about here and the most of them
aboiling, 9 Shallop Carry Sail. through the night,
Employed in sailing, Spoke Ship John Cog-
geswell 38 whale

Wednesday Sept 22 D

5 First part of the Day, Strong wind from S and Clear weather, Carrying ¹/₂ Sail. Near potter's head, Chew General, whole, Chased hard and had one Meffed, Saw 1 whale taken, 15 Sail in here and part of them a bailing, At 5 P.M. Took the wind from the N. Squally with Rain, Stood over for Sailors Bay and Reefed the topsail, weather looked threatening. Spoke N B K Warren Capt. then at 11 800 bls. borrowed 29 gallons of Molasses and gave an order on C. W. Will & Co. for pay on Retention the same.
