

Thursday Sept 30th

First part Calm Delaware close by, I went on board of her and spent the day. Latter part of the day light wind from N.E. and good weather, Made beating to the N.E. between Round Island and Old Wang Head. Made lie in the try pots and the crew washed out their clothes, Delaware abailing on 8000 whale

Friday Sept October 1st

Fresh breeze from N.W. and some rain, fair weather most the time, beating to the N.E. in company with the Delaware, between Round Island and Bird Island, Saw a number of Seal fish, Washed off the Deck, Yarned with the Delaware

Saturday Sept Oct 2nd

Light airs from W and fine weather, Steering N by W. All sail set. Employed in heading up bread pipes and broking out the ship's hold, Delaware accompanying, Saw a barque steering to the East off Bird Island, Round Island bearing N.W. distant 10 mile

Sunday Sept Oct 3rd

Light wind from S.E. and ship over cast, Steering to the S.W. accompanying with the Delaware, Stowed down 6 Casks of oil, I went on board the Delaware, At 4 P.M. Saw plenty of Bow heads at home, Large white or gray fluked whales, Several and got close on to 3 wanting a good breeze to strike, 3 Sail in sight to the West, 2 abailing and one a whaling, Prochetoff Island bearing S.E. distant 8 or 10 mile, At Sundown Main shortened sail and stood by the wind upon opposite tack through the night

Monday Oct 4th

Last night Strong gales from E and a thick rain storm, Through the day strong gales from N.W. and clear weather, Standing upon opposite tacks, Carrying double reefed topsails, Saw several whales, Spoke Ship Eliza Addams from Tarnest, been here one week and struck 3 Large whale and saved one and bailing him, Saw Mr Phillips on board the Addams, Heard from the Arctic Ocean, ships are not doing very well their, Heard ships were not doing very well on Cadiz, Heard from Ship Eliza F. Macken from the Arctic in Tarnest with 1 Bow head and 1000 whale on her passage out, Prochetoff Island bearing S distant 15 mile

Tuesday Oct 5th

Fresh wind from N.W. and clear weather, Carrying whole topsails by the wind or standing off and on Prochetoff Island, Saw 3 or 4 whale working to the East then to the West, Chased in company with the Delaware 2 Sail in sight one abailing, Prochetoff Island bearing N by W distant 10 mile
Lat by obs 55.15 Long by ch 138.23

Wednesday Oct 6th

Light wind from N.W. and fine weather, Standing off and on by Shantar, Saw 4 whale, Chased them without success, Capt Menworthy came on board, 3 Sail in sight to the West, We think of going in to Shantar Bay, Prochetoff bearing S distant 5 mile at 4 P.M. Heading N.E. Drifting to the E.S.E. Most Calm
