

Tuesday Oct 19th

Light air from N.W. and very pleasant weather. In the morning Steered off to the N.E. in company with a Ship and B.R. Harimac, Saw another Barge to the N.E. Carrying all Sail Steering to the N.E. Saw 3 Sail to the S.W. coming up, wore Ship and stood for them Hoping one of them to be the Delaware. Set the Signal with W.B. in at the main hoist most head got the answer from the Ship, one of them was the Schooner E.L. Frost and 2 strange Ships. I think from Pickle Staff Island. All Steering to the E.N.E. At 1 P.M. Steered off E.N.E. Set topmast and lower Sliding Sails, Sent aloft Mizen gaff and hord and set the Sail, Sent aloft Main hoist hord and set the Sail, bent the New Main sail, Unshipped the forward Starboard Bow Davit repaired the foresail on the yard, Main Land and Chanter Islands in sight where with Snow

Frost and let her have a gallant stay sail, She reports the ill with 1500 lbs. and Saw the Seaman 1500 lbs.

Light air from N.W. to E.N.E. and fine weather, Heading E. to S.E. by E. all Sail set, West Head land of the Scotchland Gulf in sight to the S.S.W., Schooner E.L. Frost in sight to the N.E. and Ship Lexington of Nantucket in sight closely, bent a sail for a Main topmast stay sail, Set up the bowsprit spruws, At 6 P.M. wore Ship heading N.W. Lat 43° 05' 18" Long 67° 13' 20"

Friday Oct 22nd

Light wind from N.W. and E.N.E. Heading N. and N.W. Carrying all Sail, gamed with Ship Lexington, Capt Fisher came on board and spent the Day, His Mate got his leg broke with a Cast of oil the last gale and the Lexington liked to went a Shore on the East End of Big Chanter, just got through between Big Chanter and Rochetiff and anchored on the East side of Big Chanter and found a good harbor for and E.N.E. wind or gale, Barge in sight to the W. very fine weather, At 1 P.M. breezed up from S.E. Heading N.E. by E. and Easterly

Light wind from E. to S.E. Heading from E.N.E. to N.E. all Sail set, very pleasant weather, Employed in Scraping bore, gamed with Ship Lexington, Capt Fisher, 1 Sail in sight to the N.W.

Light wind from N.E. and E.N.E. Heading E. S.E. and S.E. All Sail set fine pleasant weather, 2 Ships in sight, Big Swell coming from S.E.

Light wind from S.E. and a thick Snow Storm through the Day, At 9 P.M. wind hauled to the N.E. or E.N.E. Heading S.E. by E., 1 Ship in sight to the N.W. of us
