all Sail Steering Sails, Sat, Ship Lexington passed us,
and 6 mile ahead of us, ^{now} Watches employed in Scraping
Bone, About this time it looks more like getting out
of the Sea

Wednesday Oct 27th

Fresh breeze from S to S.W.
and Cloudy, some Snow and Rain, Carrying all Sail
Heading from S.E. to S.E., Ship Lexington in Sight
to the N.W., Head wind again

Thursday Oct 28th

First part of the Day had a fresh breeze
from S.E. and Rain, Steering S.E. by S, Carrying all
Sail, Latter part of the Day Light wind from S.W.
and Cloudy, Heading S.E. by E, A Keesoon Whale
Barge passed us, from Shouter Bay bound to Peterpo-
lisha, 300 bbls of oil on board, In the Evening Light
wind from S.E. Heading E, Chas Smith (the Carpenter)
took the Ship's Color or Signal, Plenty of Sparrows flying
around the Ship

Friday Oct 29th

Fresh wind from S.E. and Cloudy, Heading
E by S & E S.E. All Sail set, Watches employed in Scrap-
ing Bone, 3 men off Duty Sick, 3 Sail in Sight,
An old Snell coming in from W.S.W., At 6 P.M. took
heading W.S.W.

Saturday Oct 30th

Strong breeze from W and Calm
dy weather, Steering S.E. by E, Carrying all Sail,
One Sail in Sight to the N.W., Watches employed
in Scraping Bone

Lat N by obs 51, 30 Long E by Ch 153, 60

Sunday Oct 31st

First part light Air from N.W.
Heading S.E. All Sail set, Middle part of the Calm,
Heavy Snell from N.W., Land in Sight to the S.E.
At 4 P.M. took the wind from S.E. and S.E., blowed
on fresh with Snow and Rain, Closed Reaped the
topsails and taken in the Mainsail, Stood upon opposite
tacks through the Night, Ship Lexington and another
Sail in Sight to the N.W., The Small Island to the
W. of Portsmouth passage in Sight, Barreling S.E. by E
Distant 40 mile

Monday Oct Nov 1st

Last Night Strong gale from
S.E. by S and thick Rainy weather, Carrying Double Reefed
topsails upon opposite tacks, Through the Day light
wind from S and a thick foggy, with an old Snell
from S.E., Heading E by S and S.E. all Day, Latter
part Carrying whole topsails, Barometer down to 29th
quite Low, Looked for Strong Westerly gale, Foggy.
Let up steller of times but not enough to see the
Island, Saw a lot of Kelp drifted in a Row, At 6 P.M.
wore Ship and Shortened Sail for the Night, Heading
W by S
