

Tuesday Nov 2^d

Strong westerly wind and fine weather, At 3 in the morning Steered off S.E. & passed close by Ship Lexington with slight fog, At Daylight in the morning the small Island to the West of Pormashure passage bearing S.W. distant 5 mile, Set all sail and Rove the Ship to the S. by E 3 Ships accompanying, At 12 M to the East of the Islands, saw we are in the Pacific Ocean one more and a fine fair wind, Watcher employ'd in Scraping Bone, remove the Cutting Galls and put them over board to tow Lat N by 49, 34 Long E by Ch 136, 03

Wednesday Nov 3^d

Light wind from N.W. and fine weather, Steering E. by S. and E. by S, Carrying all sail, Studding sails set, Feel some what anxious to get along for tis getting late in the Season, Blue water, Nothing in sight from the Mast head, Crew employ'd in Cleaning Bone, Took in the Mast boat and put her over the Caboose long with the Bow Boat, Barometer well up for good weather

Thursday Nov 4th

First part of the Day Strong wind from S.E. by S and an old swell from N.E., Reading E by S Carrying reefed topsails, a Ship in sight to the S of us, Wind breezing on, Latter part of the Day Carrying Close reefed topsails and reefed courses, Cloudy and appearance of rain, Saw a Spout, Called it a right whale Spout, At Dark blowed very heavy from S.E. with a little rain and a heavy sea running, Have too under a Close reefed Main topsail, Main Spencer and fore topsail Staysail Ship laboring heavy, Reading N.E. by E, Barometer down to 29 1/10 Lat N by 49, 00 Long by 161, 00

Friday Nov 5th

Strong gale from S.S.W. and Rain Squally, Steering E. Carrying main top galland sail, Heavy swell from S.E. Ship laboring heavy, Crew employ'd in Scraping Bone, few Sea Yoel in sight, Blue water, At 6 P.M. Steered E by S

Lat N by 49, 00 Long E by 164, 00

Saturday Nov 6th

Light wind from S.W. and fine weather Steering E by S. Carrying all sail, Set Main top galland Studding sails, Heavy old swell from S.W. Nothing in sight but a few birds, Blue water, Unbent the Chancy from the anchor and stowed them below the Main Gun is getting tired of being in stow in the hum

Lat N by 48, 25 Long E by Ch 167, 00

Sunday Nov 7th

Strong wind from W and fine weather Steering E. and E by S, Carrying all sail, Saw nothing through the Day, Blue water, Took the Run off Joe and turned him forward

Lat by 47, 48 Long by Ch 172, 00

Monday Nov 8th

Strong wind from N.W. a little Squally, fine weather for the most part of the Day, Steering E by S through the night and East through the Day, Nothing in sight but the Heaven and the Blue Ocean, Carrying all sail, Studding sails set, Crew employ'd in Scraping Whale bone
