

Tuesday Nov 16th

Light wind from S to S.E. and very good weather. Heading E.S.E. to E. Carrying all sail. All hands employed in washing bone. Washed out the Cabin. The old blacksmith died last night. He has a bad cold and a cough. Buried him at 1 P.M. None of the crew are complaining.

Wednesday Nov 17th

Fresh wind from S to S.W. and cloudy, rainy weather and foggy. Heading from E. to S.E. For the time carrying all sail and port the time reefed topsails. All hands washing bone. Cooper setting up Shocks. Saw nothing through the day. Steward of Duty Sick.

Thursday Nov 18th

Fresh breeze from S.W. Heading S.E. by S. Carrying all sail. Frequent squalls. Squalls. All hands employed in washing bone. Cooper setting up Shocks. Nothing to be seen but few birds, blue water. Washed out my boots.

Friday Nov 19th

Light variable wind from S.W. to W.S.W. Heading S by E to E.S.E. Part of the day thick and rainy. Latter part clear weather. All sail set. Nothing in sight. Watchers employed in washing bone. Cooper setting up Shocks. 4 men off duty with the survey.

Lat 34° 30' Long W 152° 00'

Saturday Nov 20th

First part light wind from S.W. and fine weather. At 9 in the morning took the ship heading S.W. by W. At 12 M took heading E.S.E. Wind fresh from S and some clouds, and a sea from S.E. All hands employed in washing bone. Put the Boat and Row Boat on the Cranes. Help the crew sick and the other half grunting. So ended this day with a head wind and blowing on.

Sunday Nov 21st

Fresh wind from S and fine weather. Carrying whole topsails. Heading E.S.E. Saw nothing through the day. Dried part of our bone and stored it below.

Lat 34° 06' 32" Long W 148° 30'

Monday Nov 22nd

First part light wind from S and fine weather. Heading E.S.E. Latter part light variable squalls and the sea some agitated. Latter part took a fresh breeze from N. Steered S by W carrying all sail. Saw a Sulphur Bottoming. All hands employed in washing bone.

Lat 34° 06' 32" Long W 147° 45'

Tuesday Nov 23rd

Fresh trade from N.E. and good weather. Steering S carrying all sail. Saw nothing through the day but a few birds. All hands employed in washing bone. 8 men off duty with the survey.
