

Monday Feb 14th

Strong gale from NNE
and humped water. Late thick rain storm
standing off and on Clwyhee, Carrying
Close reefed topsails.

Tuesday Feb 15th

Strong wind from NNE in the ch-
annel and light in shore. Standing off and on
Tawachae Bay Carrying reefed topsails, Employed
repairing a topsail.

Wednesday Feb 16th

Strong trade wind from NE
and humped. Clear weather. Flood over tender
Alamce. Then lashed and good over to Tawachae
Bay, Carrying whole topsails. At 4 PM
Calm, Saw a Schooner working to the Eastward
under Alamce. Saw 2 barges to the South
working in the Tawachae Bay. Call them the
Barges Mary Drazier & Nancy, Henryetta.

Thursday Feb 17th

Light variable breeze and fine
weather. At 3 PM Came in to Tawachae Bay to
Anchor. On board got to the East of the ship
wally in 10 fathoms of water, 40 Ca hump Chum
I went ashore and went on board 50 lbs of
potatoes & 140 lbs beef. One schooner in here
Call it an Coft Fish here.

Friday Feb 18th

Light variable breeze and fine
weather. Ship at anchor. Saw 10 on board 8 lbs
of potatoes and 140 lbs beef. Put some on part
of them on Clwyhee on the beach. Put a fair-
sail. At 10 in the morning I went to the volcano.

At the stream of Tawachae and returned at 2 PM
At 6 PM Tave short and hoisted the sails, all head
for the land breeze. One barge in sight at 4 PM
Tave took the anchor and set all sail and steered for
Honolulu, Carried away the bolts that hold the small
falls in purchase, Shot the anchor up after a while.

Saturday Feb 19th

Moderate wind from NE and fine
warm weather. Steering to the S & W of Honolulu
all sail set. Watch employed in taring the pepping
Carpenter repairing boats, Blacksmith making shells
for a purchase fall to the windlass, Cooper repairing
Caster, Malakai & banai in sight. Malakai barge
at distant 10 miles.

Sunday Feb 20th

Light air from NE and calm. At day
light in the morning set all sail. Steering to the S & W
passed a whale ship by the side under whole topsails,
about mid channel between Honolulu & Morokai
At 7 PM up to Simon head.

Monday Feb 21st

Strong trade wind from ENE and
rain squally. Carrying reefed topsails. At 8 in
the morning S. S. M. Whetney on boats crew went
a shore at Honolulu, got my letter, 6 line whole
line, 100 lbs fresh on some of the things. Saw the
Linnex with Capt. Greene. At 4 PM returned
to the ship and set all sail and steered off
to the West or W & W, Ship H. Lee is companying.
