Lat 8 by 06 27, 07 Long 142, 10

Sunday March 27<sup>th</sup>

Light wind from S.S.W. and  
 fine weather, Steered N.E. through the night  
 in the morning Steered E by N to get to the  
 East of Katers Island and other Isle to the North  
 Close by At 12 M passed to the N of Katers Island  
 At the same time raised a great show of Sp-  
 erm Whale to the S.E. of us, chased up for  
 them, At 1 PM Close up to them, lowered  
 5 boats, Mr Whitney struck At 4 got him  
 along side and made him fast for the night  
 When stood along for the other boats, Mr Wals-  
 ey had a large whale missed and his boat mast  
 broke, These 2 whale was missed by John Sim-  
 son, At dark the boats came on board, plenty  
 of large whales in sight, scattered all over the  
 ground, and perfectly at home, some times  
 they was headed to the East and some times  
 to the S.W., At 7 PM Shortened Sail, heading

S.E. by E, Katers Island bearing S.W.  
 distant 8 mile, Peels Island in sight  
 to the South I think the whale we have  
 along side will make over 60 bbls

Lat 8 by 06 27, 54

Monday March 28<sup>th</sup>

Commenced with strong wind  
 from S.W. heading S.E. very choppy sea  
 on, At 5 in the morning called all hands  
 and commenced cutting our whale, being  
 so choppy we was obliged to wear ship and  
 cut to the leeward, cut the lunk off, then  
 cut the head and saw off and hove it in,  
 then hove the whale in, on account of the  
 hooks taking out and the hooks unhooking  
 from the head (came very much loosening it)  
 we did not get through cutting till 12 at  
 night, Left the head case lying along side

Lat 8 by 06 27, 59 75 mile  
 to the East of Peels

Tuesday March 29<sup>th</sup>

Fresh breeze from N and  
 fine weather, At 6 in the morning called  
 all hands and commenced heaving in the  
 lunk and case, Hove the lunk & case in to  
 weather, found them to be a very heavy, At 10  
 AM made sail and steered to W.S.W. for Katers  
 Island, All hands employed clearing away the  
 lunk and case and getting ready for sailing, Set  
 at 4 PM 17, 38 Long at 5 PM 142, 32, At 5 PM. saw  
 we was 3 mile. N of Katers Island or betw-  
 in Katers Island and Parys groope, Saw sev-  
 eral whale betw- the Islands, I called the  
 hump backs, pushing towards the northern side  
 of Greenland Shortened sail and stood to the E by  
 the wind Wind N.E.
