

Tuesday April 2nd

Light wind from ESE and fine weather and wind freezing on and clauding up some. Steering SE by S. All sail set. Saw a shoal of Porpoises, Coopered our sperm oil and stowed in in the blubber room at present. gauged 88 bbls, 12 Casks all branded with the ships name on each head and on the long stave. Took in the starboard bow boat and took down a boat to bathe during the last gale Sunday night 7 bbls of onions blaud & hooled off the house overboard. I am very sorry to lose our onions

Lat 34, 21 Long E by Ch 144, 40

Wednesday April 3rd

Strong gales from SE and clear weather. Heading SE by E. Carrying reefed topsails. Carpenter finished our new main hatch. Stowed our hogs and fowls in the blubber room. Weather quite cold. Set the crew most all our shops. Stowed our pumpkins below

Lat 35, 20 Long 144, 30

Thursday April 4th

Light wind from ESE. Fair weather. Heading from SE to E by E. All sail set. Painted the barrels & barriers and the white streaks on the out side the hole while. paint took in the Mast boat and put her over the top. we hys and painted her. Mr Whitney painted his room. Unbent the fore topsail. Bent another. repaired the topsail we unbent. Carpenter balling one of the new boats. Cooper repairing barrels. Black Smith making hoops for the boat masts

Lat 35, 20

Friday April 5th

Strong wind from SE and some squally. Steering SE by S. At 10 AM took in the galland sail. At 1 PM set the main top galland sail. At 6 PM Moe Mulegate on a small from E. barometer working down. Took the guns on deck and had them cleaned. finished repairing the topsail. Panted the main mast and jibbooms. Carpenter to work on the boat. Black Smith & Cooper to work at their trades. Saw some kelp on the water. Sailed through quite green water

Lat 36, 37, 22 Long E by Ch 146, 37

Saturday April 6th

Strong gales from SE, 37 and thick rainy weather. Steering SE. Carrying reefed topsails. At 4 PM wind shifted to the North and died away. Took in the fore and Mizen topsail. At 6 set them again

Lat 39, 30 Long E by Ch 149, 10

Sunday April 7th

Commences with a calm and hazy weather. At 10 AM took a light breeze from SE and cleared off some. Steering SE by E. all sail set. Saw a Kinkadee. At 5 PM wind from E and the thin thick fog and rain. Heading SE by E. put the pattern log over board
