

Thursday June 1st

Commences with fresh wind from N.E.W. and clear weather. In the morning stood to the N.W. in the ice, carrying reefed topsails, At 8 AM tacked and stood to the S.W. wind. At 10 AM came out of the ice in to a clear sea and a swell, and a thick fog. Set all sail, heading S.W. At 3 PM calm fog cleared off. Saw a sail to the W. of us and ice to the N., Capt Russell came on board and took supper with me, thick green water

Lat about 56, 40 Long about 147, 40

Friday June 3rd

Fresh breeze from S.E. and clear weather part of the time and part the time foggy. One sail a Stern and one sail a head and we are coming up with her spoke the Empire several times, steering N.W. & carrying all sail, green water and a clear sea. This morning saw a little ice to the N. of us, then heaved the wind. Laps and Carpenter made the boxes smaller for the windlapp. Had to much play

Lat by acct 56, 10 Long E by Ch 146, 40

Saturday June 4th

Commences with light wind from W and fine clear and warm weather, heading upon opposite tacks by the wind. At 3 PM wind breezed up from S.W. heading N.W. & N., saw Jones Island bearing W distant 30 mile by Chron. spoke and named with B.R. Louisa & Bedford Capt. Hathaway, Cheshire, another ship in sight to the S.W. This morning in blue water. and saw ice to the S.W. of us. main in green water

Lat by acct 56, 30 Long E by Ch 144, 15

Sunday June 5th

Fresh breeze from S and fine weather. This morning we past Jones Island. and stood in to the N.E.W. all day. At night came to the ice and saw 12 sail and 20 whale, spoke B.R. Louisa & West of Bedford 12 months out. 800 bbls 2 whale here. Louisa has 4 whale here, splended 2 whale. Heard that Capt Palmer of B.R. King Fisher was taken out of his boat and lost, whales they been seen about here. Capt Fisher let me have 2 fine boards

Lat 55, 55 Long E by Ch 152, 00

Monday June 6th

Fresh rain from S.E. and fine weather. In the forenoon lying along the S. under short sail, saw no whales. At 12 M saw a schooner to the seaward, set all sail, and steered for her and the burner. I went on board of them both, and got letters. Then cleared for steam to stop the leak in my ship.

Lat 56, 2 Long about 151, 30

Tuesday June 7th

Fresh wind from N.E. and fine weather. At 6 PM came to anchor in Green Harbor, one brig and a schooner here at anchor

Wednesday June 8th

Commences with strong wind from N and clear weather. Broke out the fore hold and leped the ship's beams out. At 2 PM calm, took the anchor and tacked in to the harbor, and anchored again. We will have the ship ready to morrow, I went ashore to see the governor
