

Thursday June 9th

Light wind blowing in to
Hian Harbor, and a swell running in which
makes it bad to work on the Stern because the
Ship pitches so much, so we got a spring on
to the Chum so the Ship lies in the bottom of
the cove, then we commenced to work on
the Stern, I went a Shore and saw the gov-
erner, he let me have Boards and Copper for to
repair my Ship

Friday June 10th

Strong wind from S.W. and
fair weather, Employed on the Ships bow,
we cant find the leak yet, got the grape
on to Day, 2 Boats went off looking, saw
nothing but Devil fish

Saturday June 11th

Light variable wind and fine
weather in here and thick fog out side, We finish-
ed repairing our bows and commenced stowing back
The governor & De La Come onboard and took tea
with me

Sunday June 12th

First part of the day strong wind
from N.E. and cloudy, All hands employed in
stowing the Ship back till 12 o'clock then found the
water running in to the Ship, Leaked the Ship and
Out a way the Sheathing on the bow and found the
bolts in the breast hook were started out & loose and loose
we are in hope to stop the leaks to morrow, I went
a Shore and mailed a letter for home, Ship Espedon Capt
Norman came in here with the Hudson Carrier, away
and Ship Onward, Capt Allen came in here to land a
sick man from the ship, with his one arm and one leg
broken

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Monday June 13th

Light wind from S and
fine weather, Leaked out of the inner Harbor
then got under weigh twice to get out
but could not stem the sea and wind
to light, so came to anchor in 20 fathoms
water and Clewed up the sail, Water in the in-
ner Harbor & Jetties

Monday June 13th

Calm and fine weather, Carpen-
ter finished repairing the Ship and the Stowed
aback and brimed Ship, All ready for sea

Tuesday June 14th

Light wind from S and fine
weather, Pulver got under weigh and head
out, I warped and tacked out of the inner Har-
bor, then got under weigh twice and
tried to get out, but could not so came
to anchor again

Wednesday June 15th

Light variable wind and hazy
weather, At 5 in the morning took our anchor, got
all back and back to sea, Carpenter making a 3rd
block, Henry a new grind stone

Thursday June 16th

Strong wind from E.N.E. and fine
weather and some haze, Steering by E. Carrying all sail,
Spoke the Ship Thomas Dye of Bedford 1 Whale, and 14 Coral
or Red for 3 Whales, Both of these Ships came up to the
Ice off Raccoon Island with me then they stood to the
North, Capt Jackson came here, Thomas Dye. keeps to
the Ice being all gone off shore, We find that one of
the Ships breast hook is loose and the Ship leaks worse
