First part of the Day

heavily the latter part of the night, At 5 A.M.
wore ship heading E. by S. At 10 A.M. wind
hauled to S. W. & commenced moderating some
heading E. N. E., cloudy weather & some cooler

Strong wind from S. W. W. to S. W.
& a big sea coming from S. some squally
and the weather cool, At 4 P.M. bent the
fore staysail, At half past 7 P.M. pitched a
way the Libboon & fore top galland mast, hove
too, up all night clearing a way wreck &
getting it on deck, Lost the fly Lib, Latter part
of the day heading S. E., Carrying
reefed topsails & courses employed in making
a Libboon out of an old main yard &
getting the rigging ready

Light wind from S. W. and good
weather, heading S. E., Carrying all sail, Cooper
and officers making a Libboon, repaired the Lib
Saw a turtle

Commencez with light
wind from S. W. & calm, At 4 P.M. took a
breeze from E. N. E. wore ship, heading S., blowed
strong through the night from E. N. E. with
a thick rain storm, steering S. by E. Carrying
reefed topsails, Latter part of the Day wind varia-
ble in squalls and plenty of rain, H. Sea drove
off one of the Cabin Deadlights, Set the Cooper to
making a new one, Rigged out the new Lib-
boon

Wednesday April 11th

First part of the Day commen-
cez with heavy squalls of wind & rain from
S. E. S. W. steering S. by W. Carrying double reefed
topsails, Set up the rigging to the Libboon,
At 4 P.M. the wind shifted to the North & clear-
ed off some, headed up off to E. N. E. At 2 A.M.
wore ship heading W. by S. & W. S. W. At 6 A.M.
wind hauled to S. W. W. wore ship, Set all sail, hea-
ding S. E. Fine weather & a moderate wind, Bent
the Lib, finished repairing the fore sail, got
out the new main topsail to fit it, found 2
places in it rotten by water leaking in to the
cask, Set the men have some clothing from
the shop cask

First part of the Day light
wind from S. W. & fair weather, heading S. E.
Carrying all sail, Fitted the new main topsail
Calm through the night, Latter part of the
Day light airs from S. & some clouds, fine
weather, steering S. Fitted the new main
sail, bent aloft the fore top galland mast
Set the crew have more thick clothing, Saw
2 Sulphur bottoms No observa
