

Wednesday June 13th

First part of the day fresh breeze from S.E. and thick weather, Caught one whale, St. C. Bell took a light breeze from W. & cleared up a short time, Saw 2 ships to the S. in the ice, Latter part of this day light wind from S. & E. and thick foggy, At half past 3 in the morning Colled all hands & took in 150 bbls of fresh water from the Rake of ice that the ship is anchored to,

Lat 55, 30 Long 140, 40
Lat about 55, 28 Long about 141, 30

Thursday June 14th

First part of this day fresh breeze from E. & S. and foggy, Stowed down 93 bbls of oil in the fore hold, Employed in Bailing, St. G. Bell Coaled down the muzzles & all hands turned in, Through the night & latter part of this day strong wind from E. & S. and a thick rain storm, Nothing a doing on board, Ship anchored to a Rake of ice, Not a grate deal of ice around us,

Lat 55, 32 Long 140, 30

Friday June 15th

First part of this day had a fresh wind from E. and a thick foggy, Lying to a Rake of ice anchored, There a whale working to the East, Started the works again, Latter part of this day light variable air & calm, Foggy, Lying anchored to the ice, Some big ice around here, Employed in bailing

Saturday June 16th

First part of this day light air & calm, Anchored to the ice, Sent 4 boats off in the ice to look for whales, Saw nothing, Latter part of this day light wind from W. & clear part of the time, Cast off from the ice & made sail & stood slowly to the S. & E., Some very big ice around us, General Williams in sight to the North, The day & whale, Lat by obs 55, 37 Long by Ch 140, 20

South West of Jones Island

Sunday June 17th

First part of the day light air from W. & fine clear weather, Ship in the ice with keels topsails set, General Williams close by, Left Fish Came on board a short time, Heavy ice, Saw no whales in the ice, General Williams Res & Whaler, At sundown took in sail & anchored to the ice, Latter part of this day light wind from S. & E. & foggy, In the morning Cast off from the ice, Lat Sall told Steered to the S. & E. Some, Saw the general in the morning, Steering S. & E., All hands employed in Stowing down 116 bbls of oil in the fore hold

Monday June 18th

Light wind from S. and thick foggy, Most of the time, Lying anchored to the ice through the night, & sail on the ship through the day, We tried to S. Some, very big ice, Saw the general Williams

Tuesday June 19th

Light wind from S. and thick foggy, Most of the day, First part of this day Carrying whole topsails in the ice, Saw 1 bowhead going S. & W. At night took in sail & anchored to the ice, In the morning Cast off from the ice, Got all sail and tried to beat to the North in the heavy scattering ice, All hands employed in Stowing 40 bbls of oil in the ground in the fore peak & breaking out some shoothes,

Wednesday June 20th

Light wind from S. & foggy, Most of the time, Carrying whole topsails through out the day & working to the East slowly through big ice, Anchored to the ice through the night, Saw a bowhead close by the ship, Heading to the S. & W.
Lat by obs 55, 26 Long by Ch 141, 00
