

Wednesday June 17th

First part of the day light wind from N.E. and good weather, steering N.W. by E, carrying all sail, Middle & latter part of the day calm, all hands employed in Bailing & Cleaning Bone, Saw a Ship to the East of us aboarding, Land in Sight to the N.W.

Sat by 6, 55, 02

Thursday June 18th

First part of the day light fresh wind from N.W. and good weather, heading N.E. All sail set, watches all hands employed in Bailing, hauling up the Chane Cables & bending them & Cleaning Bone, through the night fresh wind from N.E., steering N.W. for Kian, latter part of the day light air from N.W. & fine weather, steered to the South under all sail for Murkary Bay, could not yet catch Kian on account the wind being ahead, slowing down oil

Friday June 19th

Light westerly breeze & fine weather, heading to the South, all sail set, trying to get to Murkary Bay, all hands employed in slowing down oil in the Mizen hold,

Sat by 6, 55, 40 Long by Ch 140, 7

Saturday June 20th

First part of this day light wind from N. and good weather, heading S.W. all sail set, calm through the night, latter part of this day fresh wind from East and hazy weather, steering for Murkary Bay, carrying all sail, at 12 all saw Bird Island to the S.E. distant 10 miles, saw by Shanten to the N.W. plenty of ice around Bird Island

S Off Round Island

Sunday July 1st

First part of this day strong wind from E.N.E. and hazy weather & cloudy, steering for Round Island, all sail set. At 2 P.M. spoke S.W. Capt Davis, Cleam, reports the George & Mary Stone by the Ice & Lunter, the is from S.W. Bay, 15 Ships in N.E. Harbor & S.W. Bay packed with ice, General Williams & George Howland to the South of Round Island, at 5 P.M. came up to the Ice to the South of us. Middle & latter part of the day light air from S. and a thick fog, clear the water near to the West in by Shanten gut and the Ice to the S.E.

Round Island, bearing N.W. distant 6 miles

Monday July 2nd

First part of this day light air from S. and foggy, ship in clear water 6 miles S.W. of Round Island. At 1 P.M. fog lifted. Saw a cow & calf, lowered for them. Latter part of this day light wind from South and fine weather, bent to the S.W. sent off 3 boats in the Ice a whaling struck a whale, one from ship cut & the other from crew. Saw a whale in the Ice in the middle of the Bay, & Ships in sight working up to the Ice, Ice heavier up Bay. Squared Island bearing W. distant 6 m.

Tuesday July 3rd

Light wind from S. & fine weather, first part of the day, 4 boats off whaling. Saw several whale towards old Mans Head in the thick Ice, struck one whale & lost 400 fathoms line, I went on board the General Williams & got some flags, reports seeing plenty of whale in Saghalien gulf but going quick & shy, latter part of the day in the Ice with the sails furled & anchor down part of the time trying to drag out of the Ice to the South East, all the Ships are off Round Island in clear water, a Russian Barge to the S.W. of us in the mouth of Lailas Bay, Little Shanten gut to the West of us, Washington Head bearing S.E. by W., saw no whales, saw the General Williams Boat fast to a whale
