

Cape Ukoz Behotsk Sea

looked for spars but could not find any around Cape Ukoz

Friday Sept 28th

Light S.W. wind and fair weather
Montezuma layed to anchor under Cape Ukoz
First part of the Day, got 2 boat loads of wood from
shore, then got under way & the wind was so light we
could not get out, so came to anchor, saw whales
under the Cape, sent a loft the main top gallant
mast, latter part of the Day sent off 3 boats a
whaling & 2 boats cut & got off 3 boats loads of
wood, saw bowheads & several fish under the Cape
struck a several fish & crew, struck a large bow
head & got him

Saturday Sept 29th

Light Southerly wind and fine weather
Took a whale along side the ship and towed him
in under Cape Ukoz and anchored in 18 fathoms
water, & cut our whale in, latter part of the Day
4 boats off whaling, saw 6 bowheads and one several
fish, cleared away the deck and got ready to start
the week

Sunday Sept 30th

Light Southerly wind and fine weather
Montezuma to anchor under Cape Ukoz in 17 fathoms
water, the East point of the Cape bearing E. by S. 4 boats
off whaling, saw 3 whales & plenty of white fish off the
Cape, saw a brig & a ship coming from the North
along shore, saw a ship to the South steering to the N.E.
Took a draft of Cash a shore to fill with fresh water,
Elected the ship in nigher the Cape, Employed in sailing

Off Cape Ukoz To Anchor

Monday Oct 1st

Fresh wind off shore from E. & E. and
Calm in the harbor, Montezuma to anchor under
Cape Ukoz, 4 boats off whaling, saw 1 whale going
S.W. A Russian brig & a Dutch barque came in
here to anchor, saw ship Isaac Howland & schooner
Caroline steering to the S.W. along shore

Tuesday Oct 2nd

Light wind off shore from E. & E. and calm
under Cape Ukoz, first part of the Day all the boats off
whaling, Employed in sailing I went onboard the Dutch
barque & onboard the Russian brig, after second mate died
very sudden & they buried him here, latter part of the
Day Elected the ship nigher in shore & got off a draft of
water from shore, the Capt of the brig came onboard of us

Wednesday Oct 3rd

First part of the Day fresh breeze from
N.E. and a thick fog out side, thickened & showed our
water, Employed in sailing, 2 boats off whaling, latter
part of the Day blowed a heavy gale from N.E. and a
thick storm off shore & cloudy over the land, heavy
swell heaving in under the Cape, laying in 15 or 16
fathoms water, with the small anchor down & all
the chane out, set much strain on the chane because
the current set us to the windward, all hands
stowing down ail in the fore peak, and boiling, the
Russian brig left this morning, working heavy off
the Cape & knocked the ship down some

Thursday Oct 4th

Throughout this Day blowed a heavy
gale from N.E. and thick weather, first part of the
Day, stowing down ail, latter part of the Day had a
thick rain & snow storm, a heavy swell roll-
ing in under the Cape & the ship rolling some
