

In West Longitude

Sunday Oct 18th

Strong wind from S and
cloudy weather, heading E.S.E. Carrying single
reefed topsails
Lat N by obs 41 35 Long W by Ch 162, 27

Monday Oct 19th

First part of the Day strong wind
from S and cloudy, heading E.S.E. Carrying reefed
topsails, blowed on in the night & close reefed the
topsails. At 2 AM blowed very heavy with
plenty of rain, hove to under a close reefed main
topsail. At 4 AM calm with a rough sea on, ship
rolling bad, at 6 AM took the wind from W
and blowed up strong, steered off S.E. by E and
sat double reefed topsails & foresail, Mate off
Duty Sick

Tuesday Oct 20th

Lat N by obs 39, 35 Long W by Ch 159, 13
First part of this day strong gales from
W and squally, steering S.E. by E. Carrying reefed topsails,
through the night steering S.E. by E. Wind N.W. & clear.
 Latter part of the day moderate wind from W and good
weather. All sail sat, steering S.E. by E. Broke out the
fore hold for pipe shocker, Cooper repairing cash, for
water

Wednesday Oct 21st

Lat N by obs 37, 35 Long W by Ch 156, 50
First part of this Day light wind from
S.E. by E and good weather, steering S.E. by E. All sail sat,
Kinsie breaking out for pipe shocker. During the
night wind hauled to E.S.E. heading S. Latter part
of the Day wind S.E. by S. At 10 AM took ship
heading E by S. Employed in washing off the
side of the main house

Lat N by obs 33, 33

In the Longitude of the Islands

Thursday Nov 1st

First part of the Day fresh breeze from
S.E. by S and good weather, heading E by S. All sail
sat, watch washing off the main house, at 12 AM
night took ship heading S.W. At 5 AM took
ship & steered S.E. Wind hauled to the S.W. and main
ed hard in squalls, employed in washing off the star
board side of the starboard bulwarks, Mate confined
to his room

Friday Nov 2nd

Lat N by obs 33, 13 Long W by Ch 154, 48
Light breeze from S.W. to W and calm
steering S.E. All sail sat. Fine weather, watch
employed in washing the bulwarks, Cooper
setting up pipe shocker for fresh water, saw
some squid. I think there has been sperm whales
along there

Saturday Nov 3rd

Lat N by obs 34, 42 Long W by Ch 153, 38
First part of the day light wind from W steering
S.E. First part of the night, wind from S.S.E. heading E, latter
part of the night & Day fresh breeze from S.W. steering S.E.
by S. All sail sat, commenced to wash off the out side
of the ship, dried some of the bone & shifted it over on
the starboard side

Sunday Nov 4th

Lat N by obs 33, 04 Long W by Ch 152, 45
Moderate wind from W and fine
weather, steering S.E. by S. All sail sat. At 4 PM
saw a ship or a barque steering to the S.E. I
call her one of the Honolulu packets bound to
Piseco, dried some of the whale lines, put the
fast & bow boat out on the Chaney, Mate off
Duty with a sore finger
