

Point Eugenia

Wednesday Feb 27th

Strong wind from N.E. and
of kugged weather, All hands on board, Saw
some Seal fish pup, Capt Brown came
on board and spent the afternoon, Saw a
Ship leave Turtle Bay

Thursday Feb 28th

Fresh breeze from S and some
squally, 4 Boats off whaling, Saw a few
whales going north

Friday Feb March 1st

Light westerly wind and
some rainy, 4 Boats off whaling, Saw several
gangs of whales going north, Electra got her
12th whale, A Mexican Schooner of war came
to anchor close to us, She wants fresh water,
Mr Sheerman is mate of her

Saturday March 2nd

Fresh wind from N.E. and
and some kugged, 4 Boats off whaling, Caught
a whale & sunk him, Electra got a whale,
I sold 23 1/2 dollars worth of head flannel & Staps
to the Mexican Schooner and let her have
700 gallons of fresh water, I went on board
the Schooner Oliva Capt Redfield, He gave me
a letter from Capt Kenworthy & 2 Chests & reports
the logs of the Delaware in Balena, Saggoon

Sunday March 3rd

Strong wind from N.E. and
kugged weather, Hauled our whale up and towed
him to the ship & he sunk, 4 Boats off whaling
Saw plenty of whale, Bombed one, Electra got her
14th whale, Capt Brown went to Turtle Bay to see
about shipping her oil home

Monday March 4th

Fresh wind from N.E. and kugged
In the morning we hauled up our whale & cut him
in, Sent off 3 Boats a whaling Bombed a whale &
struck him and sunk him, Saw plenty of whales
going north, Bombed another, and did not get him,
Started the works, Capt Brown came back from
Turtle Bay

Tuesday March 5th

Light wind from the north west and
dropten off the point, Finished Bailing, 4 Boats in
whaling, Saw several large gangs of whales going
north, Bombed one & ray hooked another, Hauled
our whale up & towed a whale, the line parted and
the whale went to the bottom, left him and
we came on board, A small schooner passed there to day

Wednesday March 6th

First part of this day light wind
from north, and fine weather, got our whale to the
ship & cut him in, Sent off 3 Boats a whaling,
Bombed one whale, Saw plenty of whales going north
Started the works, We find the whales very poor,
now they are going north

Thursday March 7th

Strong wind from north west
and kugged weather, 3 Boats off whaling, Saw a few
whales but made no chance, Saw 4 Ships
coming from Samings Saggoon, Finished Bailing
our whale
