

In the South Atlantic

Monday June 10th

Fresh breeze from W by S and fine weather, steering S by E and made a S by E Course, We have found the last 3 Days a 4 Knot Current setting up to the Eastward at the rate of 4 mile per hour repaired a fore gulland sail

Lat by obs 56, 18 Long by Ch 54, 10

Tuesday June 11th

First part of the Day fresh wind from S.E. heading S.W. coming all sail, a thick rain storm, latter part of the Day light airs from S.W. heading S.W. 1 P.M. back around the ship, Met the cold once a week while in cold weather, gone the last 24 hours 95 mile S by E

Wednesday June 12th

Fresh wind from S.W. and cloudy weather, heading S.W. carrying all sail, saw a grampoides, we have a grate deal of Northerly wind and rainy weather

Thursday June 13th

Strong gales from S.W. and thick rainy weather, heading S.W. carrying double reefed topsails, At 6 P.M. came up to S by W

Lat about 53 Long about 48, 20
49, 40

Friday June 14th

Strong wind from W and clear weather, steering S by W. carrying all in top gulland sail

Lat by obs 50, 18 Long by Ch 48, 30

To the N.E. of the Falkland's Is.

Saturday June 15th

First part of the Day fresh wind from S by W heading S by E, last night heading S by E. Wind from W.S.W. to S.W. latter part of the Day blowed on strong and squally with rain, heading S.E. came down to reefed topsails, At 4 P.M. wind shifted to W.S.W. closed reefed the topsails, ship picked up the S.W. fly, bilboons under the water, steered off S.W.

Lat by obs 49, 00

Sunday June 16th

Last night strong gales from W.S.W. and some squally, steering S.W. carrying close reefed topsails, first part of the Day wind hauled to S.W. and blowed up heavy, with thick squalls of wind & rain, took in all sail but the close reefed main topsail, steered S.E. heavy sea on At 12 M. wind hauled to S.W., set the topsails double reefed and set the fore sail, steered S.W. ship rolling about heavy

Lat about 47, 40

Monday June 17th

First part of the Day strong wind from S.W. and rain squally, heading S.W. carrying double reefed topsails, latter part of the Day strong wind from W and rain squally, steered S.W.

Lat by obs 46, 12 Long by Ch 42, 41

Tuesday June 18th

First part of the Day light wind from S.W. and rain squally, heading S.W. all sail set, latter part of the Day wind hauled to W and blowed up strong with squalls, double reefed the topsails, steering S.W. At 8 P.M. wind moderate set all sail
