

In the North of Thirty South

Saturday June 29th

First part of the day light wind from S.W. to E. and cloudy. Latter part of the day fresh breeze from E. and rainy. Steering N.E. by N. All sail set, catching some fishing, saw 2 sheep to the west of us standing to the E. by the wind.
Lat by obs 29, 40 Long by Ch 27, 25

Sunday June 30th

First part of this day light wind from E.N.E. heading N. Rainy weather. Latter part of the day light wind from N.E. heading E. by S. Saw a Kaimoan.
Lat by obs 27, 15 Long by Ch 26, 26

Monday July 1st

Light wind from S.W. and fine weather. Brought out the fore hold and put the heads in the washbasin, saw 3 sheep standing to the Eastward by the wind, saw 1 Bullfinch bottom.
Lat by obs 26, 30

Tuesday July 2nd

Light air from S.W. and calm, steering N.E. by N. Fine weather, scraped off the bends & washed off the outside of the ship and got ready for painting. Saw 2 Kaimoan and a Barquet standing to the S.E., considerable swell on.
Lat by obs 25, 40 Long by Ch 24, 40

Wednesday July 3rd

Light breeze from S.W. by W. and fine weather heading N.E. by E. All sail set, An old Swallow holeing in from S.E. Healed the ship and painted the Starboard side bronze color.

Moderate wind from N. to N.W. heading from N.E. to N.W. Corring all sail. At 10 A.M. spoke a Hamburg Barque 45 days out bound to Delago Bay, East Coast of Africa, sent a boat on board of her and got a bag of Potatoes, they told us the Northern states was to war with the Southern states, employed on the kidnapping, our Captain has tried first rate.
Lat about 24, 50 Long about 23, 10

Friday July 5th

Fresh squally W. wind and rain from N.W. to W.N.W. heading from N.E. to N.W. All sail set, saw a Kaimoan, had a grate fall of rain through the day. Burst the flyable.
Lat by obs 23, 20 Long W by Ch 22, 32

Saturday July 6th

Light air from N.W. and calm heading to the N.E. All sail set, flaking against the mast, sent down the cutting pendents for to put a stopper on one of the Starboard main shrouds that was parted.
Lat by obs 22, 57

Sunday July 7th

Calm all day, nothing doing, very fine weather.
Lat by obs 22, 50

Monday July 8th

Fresh breezes from N.W. heading N.W. All sail set, heeled the ship and painted the after part of the starboard waist, made some halling stuff, saw a ship steering to the Southward.
