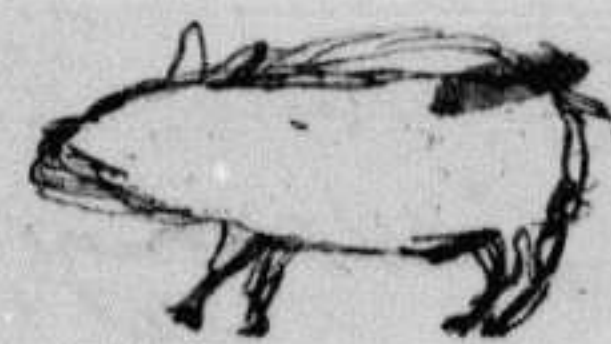
Friday Sept 4th
