Tuesday Sept 8th

Begins light air and fine weather steering S W at 6 P.M. spoke the Planters had got nothing since we saw her before had seen a White whale 24 hours before then we had part fine weather saw plenty of fishbacks to ends the day employed in searching the Planters in sight.

Sat 30.05, 119.4

Wednesday Sept 9th

Begins fine weather in company with the Huntress Middle and set part the same to ends the day Sat 30.26 c to 118

Thursday Sept 10th

Begins strong winds and squally standing to the S at 3 P.M. took in sail to the Huntress M I and on F sail at 6 noon ship on took in the fore sail and set the fore stay sail at 7 A.M. took it in and set the fore sail to ends

Sat 30.00

Friday Sept 11th

Begins a gale with rain and thick squalls at sundown took in the F sail and set the F stay sail and wore ship to the S by latter part hauled to the S all hands employed in making Diggers to ends

Sat 29.23 Long 110.25

Saturday Sept 12th

Begins a gale from S going to the S and E under 2 reefed topsail and F sail at sundown wore ship to the S W at daylight hauled to the E ends the same fine weather saw nothing Sat 29.20 Long 110.49

Sunday Sept 13th

Begins pleasant with light air from S standing to the E at sundown shortened sail and wore ship to the Westward had fine weather had to West saw nothing Sat 29.05

Monday Sept 14th

Begins light air and overcast weather from S W standing to the W at 4 P.M. hauled to the S at sundown shortened sail Middle and latter part a gale from S W to ends the day all hands employed in making Diggers to ends

Sat 30.70, 109.09

Tuesday Sept 15th

Begins a gale from S W standing to the S E at midnight hauled to S tracked to the W S W latter part moderated set top sails and M. T. Gallant sail saw fishbacks to ends

Wednesday Sept 16th

Begins a strong breeze from S standing to the Westward at 2 took in M. T. G. sail at sundown shortened sail hauled to S Middle part the latter part light air at 10 A.M. saw a large sperm whale hauled and chased without success to ends the day Sat 30.18 Long 109.50

Thursday Sept 17th

Begins light air from S W standing to the S E at sunset shortened sail as usual then latter part a fine breeze standing to the S E to ends the day employed in making M. T. Gallant sail Sat 30.48 Long 110.51.30

Friday Sept 18th

Begins a fine breeze on squally from S W standing to the S E with all sail set employed in all conversation and playing the fiddle at short sail latter part strong gales and squally to ends standing S W under 2 reefed topsails and M. T. sail employed in making this good to ends

Saturday Sept 19th

Begins strong gales and squally standing to the S W under short sail at sundown shortened sail hauled to S W latter part took ship Newark of Roughton in the morning 1600-350 sperm to ends the day Sat 32.02 Long 110.18
