

Thursday Nov 26th

Begins light winds and thick rainy weather
standing to the N.E. sent down the T. sail
on T. Reformed it struck and sent a Reprise
at 3 P.M. wind A more ship and then
I W at sunset double reefed the T. sails and
up the courses and steered the same
Middle port wind hauled to S.W. and
blowed on strong with plenty of rain at
daylight took in T. on and began T. sails
and finished the T. sail Ends the same
time 12:00 P.M. O.C. O.C.

Friday Nov 27th

Begins with a gale from S.W. Laying to the
S.E. under close reef M. T. sail at sunset
more moderate but the T. sail middle port
the same at daylight set double reef T. sails
Ends the same very much Laying to the
S.W. saw one Fin Back Lat 39.14 Long 112.55

Saturday Nov 28th

Begins strong winds from W. and very
much storming southerly under double reef
T. sails I & P. saw 1 Wright whale
Lover & Root on Struck the iron board
went on board took in T. on and began
T. sails at sunset saw 2 Wright whales
to make out to reef to Lover & Root
made sail and stood to the S. at 10
saw the ship Unceas Capt Eldredge
with 200 sperm and 3 Wright whales
thus Ends the day Lat 39.33

Sunday Nov 29th

Begins fine weather at 4:00 Lover and
got a Whale but 2 bones in him
Belonging to the Unceas latter part
strong breezes and some rain Employed in
cutting the Whale thus Ends the Unceas
in light cutting Lat

Monday Nov 30th

Begins strong winds and heavy then one
one whole Lover and sent him
different tasks and ~~all~~ all hands employed
in boiling at sundown took in sail and lay
to the South latter part fine weather saw
nothing thus ends the Unceas in light Lat

Tuesday December 1st

Begins fine weather wind from S.W. standing
to the S. at 10 P.M. Lover & Root & W. & A
on T. sail at sundown finished boiling
took in sail and lay to the South at daylight
made sail and stood S.W. saw a number of
Fin backs at 10 A.M. saw 4 Whales Lover and
struck at noon took the Whale to the ship
thus Ends the day Lat 40.10

Wednesday Dec 2nd

Begins fine weather light air from S.W.
all hands employed in cutting at 3 finished
and began to boil middle port the same
standing to the W. at daylight made all
sail and stood on different tasks but saw
nothing the Unceas in sight a cutting
thus ends employed in boiling Lat 40.14

Thursday Dec 3rd

Begins fine pleasant weather with a fine
breeze from S.W. at 2 P.M. saw a number of
Whales Lover and Root one and struck one
and struck him chosen another but could
not strike at sundown took in sail and
lay to the W. middle finished boiling Lover
on a gale from S.W. took in T. sail and close
up the M. T. sail latter part the same
all hand employed in stowing down thus Ends
in sail and a number of Whales in sight Lat 40.19

Friday Dec 4th

99

Begins a gale from W. all hands employed in stowing down
& sails in light and plenty of Whales latter part
more moderate saw nothing employed in setting
up Ropes so Ends Lat 40.20
