

Ship Montpelier Borne in too Geograph Bay
Friday Dec 15th

Begins with light airs from S.W. and a very heavy swell
standing to the S.E. employed in mending Fore Top, Sails
Bent Mizzen Top, Gallant sail sent out Fly Jibb Deck
on Bent the sail at 3 P.M. set the Land having
S. by E. Distance 12 Leagues at 4 square the yards
and steered in for the land at sunset kept off N.W.
and took in Fly Jibb at 3 A.M. was in for the
land Latter part Light airs off the land to ends
the land of our stevedore began all hands
employed in cleaning ship Lot 34.01

Saturday Dec 16th

Begins with light airs from S.W. and clear
at 2 saw a Sulphur Peak at sunset shifted
to the wind of Cape Matherelst took in
I. Gallant sails and double reefed the Top sails
and lay off and on at daylight made all
sail and stood in to the Bay one ship
a steamer of us Borne in at noon came
to our anchor in Geograph Bay at the
same time the Fibernia came to
our anchor Capt. Cook 4000 sperm 11 light
whale the shipolaen at anchor
1400 sperm so ends the day

Sunday Dec 18

All these 24 hours Light airs from S
Latter part one weather on Liberty
so ends the day

Monday Dec 19th 1840

Begins with a fresh breeze from S.E.
and much on Liberty ends much the same

Monday January 2nd 1841

First part of these 24 hours Got under way in
Company with the shipolaen and ran down
to Castle Rock Latter part employed in getting
wood and water so ends the day

Thursday Jan 4th

Begins fresh breeze from S.E. middle part the
same at 9 A.M. took our anchor in Company
with the shipolaen and went to sea Left Lying
in Port ships Unions Ulbridge Fulmouth 700
sperm 300 Whale Little Salmon Capt Hall 250
sperm 950 Whale Fibernia 400 sperm 500 Whale
Bark Gullam Day 5 months out no oil

Friday Jan 5th

Begins with a strong breeze from S. Course S.W.
at 4 P.M. took in I. and Mizzen T sails and
doubt reefed the main Latter part more weather
steered W under short sail so ends the day
Lot 33.28 = 113.3

Saturday Jan 6th

Begins a strong breeze from S steering W at 4
P.M. spoke the shipolaen the had seen 3
schools of whales and been chasing all
day without success Latter part a fresh
breeze stood on different track but saw
nothing so ends the day Lot 33.16 = 113.20

Sunday Jan 7th

Begins a fresh breeze from S standing to
the S.W. the shipolaen in Company at
sundown took in sail and lay to the W
Latter part a strong breeze standing to the
W a sail set so ends Lot 33.18 Long 112.20

Monday Jan 8th

Begins fine weather wind from S standing
to the W at sundown took in sail and
stood to the S.E. middle part the same
Concludes strong breeze standing West
so ends Lot 33.30
