

Tuesday Jan 12th

Begins a strong breeze from S standing to the W employed in Repairing sails at 3 P.M. spoke the ship Barclay Briggs N Bedford 800 bbls of oil the Ann Lapham 600 bbls (500) - grinn Balm home at sundown took in sail and lay to the E at daylight made sail and steered W & W ends the same 4 ships in sight the Ann in company all hands employed in Working Littered Long 111.10

Wednesday Jan 13th

Begins a fresh breeze from S steering W & W in company with the Ann at sunset took in sail and lay to the East at daylight made sail and steered W & W so ends the day saw nothing Lat 33.00

Thursday Jan 14th

Begins fine weather - wind from S steering W & W at 3 squared the goods and steered N at sunset took in sail and lay to the W at daylight made sail and steered N at 9 spoke the Ann she had been lost to a large whale the day before but lost him so ends the day Lat 32.01

Friday Jan 15th

Begins a fresh breeze from S and cloudy ship standing to the S & E at sunset took in sail and lay to the E at daylight made sail at 6 P.M. saw 2 large grinn Whales show along to whom they went down hauled about the chain yard and lay 1 hour saw nothing more of them Ends a strong breeze 1 sail in sight Lat 31.48 = 109.57

Saturday Jan 16th

Begins with a fresh breeze from S standing to the E at 3 P.M. spoke the Barclay at sundown shortened sail and wore ship to the W at daylight made sail Ends fine weather saw nothing Lat 31.34 = 109.39

Sunday Jan 17th

Begins with a fresh breeze from S standing to the Eastward at sundown shortened sail and wore ship latter part wind from W standing Southwesterly so ends the day Lat 31.31 = 109.52

Monday Jan 18th

Begins a strong breeze from S and squally standing Southwesterly at sundown shortened sail middle part wore ship to the W ends the same saw nothing Lat 31.31

Tuesday Jan 19th

Begins a strong breeze of S and a heavy swell steering N at sunset shortened sail and hauled to the W at daylight set a reef of sails and steered to the N at 9 A.M. saw a large French man of war but saw nothing more of it so ends Lat 30.34

Wednesday Jan 20th

Begins a strong breeze and Breeze steering N & under short sail at 5 saw a sail standing Eastward at sunset took in sail and lay to the East latter part a strong breeze steered Northwesterly so ends the day in sight Lat by Obs 29.39

Thursday Jan 21st

Begins a strong breeze and very much at 1 P.M. spoke the Hercules Steamer N B 100 bbls of oil at sunset took in sail and lay to the S & W at daylight made sail and steered to the V so ends Hercules in sight Lat 30.43
