part set the F and Mizzen Top sails Clear up
so ends the day standing to the C.W. standing
saw nothing Lat 26.10

Tuesday January 26th

Begins strong winds and a heavy
squall standing to the C.W. under short
sail middle part the same Latter part more
moderate set single reef Tails and Courses
at noon took in ship and stood to the E
so ends the day saw nothing Lat 25.24 = 108.18

Wednesday Janry 27th

Begins with a fresh breeze from C
standing to the E under single reef Tops
sails and Courses at sunset took in the
C.W. sail and double reefed the Tails
middle part the same Latter part standing
Easterly single reef Tails Lat 26.26

Begins with a fresh breeze from S standing to the
E under single reef Tails and Courses at 5 P.M. saw
a school of sperm whales going quick to the

noon ship and stood to the E saw nothing Lat 29.06 = 108.06

Friday 29th

Begins with strong breeze and very raged weather
standing to the Eastward at 5 P.M. more ships heading
S.W. lost near the fore and Mizzen Top sails
took in main sail and Tails middle part the same. Ends
more moderate standing to the S.W. under Top sails
and Courses saw nothing Lat 29.50 Long 107.18

Saturday 30th

Begins fine weather standing to the S.W. under all
sail at sunset shortened sail and more ship
to the E middle part the same Latter part more
ship and stood to the S.W. so ends the day
saw nothing Lat 30.06 Long 106.51

Sunday 31st

Begins with a strong breeze from S standing to the
S.W. under short sail middle part the same
at daylight made sail and more ship to the E
at the same time a Merchant ship passed us
steering S.W. Ends fine weather nothing
in sight Lat 30.46 Long 106.40

Monday February 1st

Begins with a fresh breeze from S and
Clear standing to the E at sunset shortened sail
middle part flying up the F and Mizzen Tails
saw a ship steering W by S
sails Ends strong breeze and raged standing
to the Eastward under double reef Tails and
Courses Nothing in sight Lat 30.20 Long 107.50
