

Ship Montpelier On the Coast of N. Holly
Wednesday February 17th

Begins a fresh breeze from S standing to the
SE at sunset shortened sail latter part strong
breeze and thick smoky weather saw nothing
during the day Lat 24.24

Thursday 18th

Begins a strong breeze and smoky steam to the
SE middle part lay by the main latter steam to
the SE with fine weather all sail set so runs
the day saw nothing Lat 23.20 Long 111.50

Friday 19th

Begins fine weather light air from E steering
nothing at 3 P.M. saw a ship to the S.W.
Chasing maddles at sundown shortened sail and
lay to the W latter part smoky steam to
the SE saw nothing Lat 22.43 = 110.02

Saturday 20th

Begins light air on E clear steam to
the SE at sunset shortened sail and
steamed to the W at daylight made all sail
latter part fine pleasant weather steamed to the

Sunday 21st W saw a school of greyhorses to E Lat 22.29

Begins light air and pleasant steam to the W
W saw plenty of Finbacks and Albatross at
sunset shortened sail and lay to the W at daylight
made sail and steamed to the W under the same
fine weather saw a school of greyhorses 21.51

Monday 22nd

Begins with a fine breeze from W and clear warm
ships and steamed to the South at 4 P.M. saw a
Buach on the sea ice ran down and lay about
40 on hour but saw nothing more of it at sunset
shortened sail latter part steamed to the SE
W all sail set saw nothing Lat

Ship Montpelier On the Coast of N. Holly
Tuesday February 23rd

Begins with a fine breeze from W and
clear warm ships and steamed to the SE at sunset shortened
sail middle part the same at daylight made all sail
ends fine weather heading to the SE Lat 22.40 = 110.42

Wednesday 24th

Begins a fresh breeze from SE at 2 P.M. warm ships
and steamed to the W at 4 double reefed the top
sails at sunset took in sail and lay to the W at 10
P.M. Thick and rainy winds headed in to the SE and
blow strong called all hands and took in F sail and
clear up the SE sail lines fine weather wind from
E steering I saw nothing Lat 23.37

Friday 25th

Commences light air on clear from E steering Sails
sail set at dusk took in F and Mizen top gallant sails
and J by gills middle part the same steering S latter
part a fresh breeze from SE and smoky ships
heading SE with all sail set saw nothing Lat 23.37 = 109.35

Saturday 26th

Commences a fresh breeze from S and smoky
steaming to the WSW all sail set at sunset shortened
sail middle part the same at daylight set F sails
and Commences ends the same a strong breeze and very
mild heading W by S saw nothing Lat 24.37 = 108.26

Saturday 27th

Commences a fresh breeze and very dry from SE standing
to the SE under F sails and Commences at 2 double reefed the
F sails and steamed N sail and J by gills middle part the
same latter part strong winds and thick smoky
weather steamed to the SE saw nothing Lat 25.24 = 107.21

Sunday 28th

Begins with strong winds and smoky from SE
steaming to the E under short sail at 4 broke the ship
a piece of Robert Town 6 weeks out had not seen
a whale at sunset took in F and J sails latter
part same as the first steamed to the W saw nothing Lat 25.25 = 107.27
