

Nonpareil On the Coast of N. Holland  
Friday May 28<sup>th</sup>

Begins strong Gale and much standing to the  
the under short sail down 1 fathoms at dusk  
hook in 1/2 fathoms and to the S.W. at  
midnight more to the S. Letter post stands to  
the S.W. under short sail standing in light

Saturday May 29<sup>th</sup>

Begins strong Gale and much under short  
sail standing to the S. at dusk hook in sail  
Letter post stands to the S.W. under short  
sail so ends the day & sails in light and

Sunday May 30<sup>th</sup>

Begins strong Gale and much standing in  
different fathoms but saw no fish at dusk hook  
in sail middle and Letter post fine weather  
fine pleasant & sails in light

Monday May 31<sup>st</sup>

Begins fine weather at 5 P.M. made the  
Lighthouse the first seen a large whale the  
day before at dusk shortened sail and to  
the S. Letter post stands to the S. all sail set  
saw a humpback so ends sail in light Lat 22.30

Tuesday June 1<sup>st</sup>

Begins fine weather standing to the S.W.  
all sail set at dusk hook in sail and to  
the S. at daylight set all sail ends  
the same saw a number of fin backs Lat 22.39  
Long 106.59

Wednesday June 2<sup>nd</sup>

Begins fine weather ship standing to the  
N.E. at dusk hook in the light sails and  
up the courses heading to the S. at  
2 P.M. wind hauls in equally to the  
S.W. double reefed the top sails ends  
much the same standing to under  
short sail saw a humpback Lat 22.20  
Long 107.08

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Thursday June 3<sup>rd</sup>

Begins a moderate gale from S. standing to under  
short sail at 3 P.M. ship on Antlerkey sea  
and took the Bow Boat of the Cooness Towen  
the Starboard boat and took her along side and  
hoisted her up without any damage lost the two  
head irons middle post lay to the S.W. Letter post  
more moderate set all sail and steered to S.  
ends the day saw nothing set

Friday June 4<sup>th</sup>

Begins light airs and calm with a heavy  
swell from S.W. Cooness at W at 3 the sail  
fetched away between decks and then a pipe of  
spirit oil lost 2 gallons of oil middle post  
calm Letter post light airs from E.P.E. Cooness  
W employed in bending new fore sail and  
main sail and shudding sails set Lat 21.53

Saturday June 5<sup>th</sup>

Begins a light breeze from S.E. set the  
Fore Top mast and lower standing sails at 5  
set the M.T.G. shudding sail at 4 set the  
watch whole watches bound to the Lagoon of  
Padanque middle and Letter post light airs from  
S.E. so ends the day Lat 21.58

Sunday June 6<sup>th</sup>

Begins light airs from N.W. fine weather sent  
the Main Rigging at 2 P.M. saw a humpback  
called a humpback at dusk set the M. Royal  
middle post a fine breeze Letter post strong gale  
from S.W. hook in M.T.G. shudding sail so ends  
shudding to by 1 nothing in light Lat 22.10 = 101.53

Monday June 7<sup>th</sup>

Begins a strong breeze and squally from N.W.  
heading to S.W. at 2 took in 7 and 10 fms T.G.  
sails and fore topmast standing sail at 5 double  
reefed the top sail at 9 more ship to the S.W. at  
12 set whole T. sails and M.T.G. sail at daylight saw a large  
humpback by dusk but saw nothing more ends a fine breeze from  
S.W. heading S.W. plenty fin backs in light Lat 22.47
