

Montpelier From Madagascar Towards St. Helena
Tuesday July 27th

Begins calm the watch employed in shipwreck at 3 P.M.
Lowered to Boat and tried the Current found there
was none any way at 6 a light breeze from N.E. set the
standing sails middle part strong breeze from N.E.
Lowered W by South latter part hauld to the N.W.
steered W took in all the standing sails to end of day
Lat 33° 13' Long 23° 48'

Wednesday July 28th

Begins a fine breeze from N.W. hauling gradually
to the W heading to the Land W at 6 miles from
W breeze on foot in all Rigall Top Gallard sails
and Fly Sails at 8 double reefed the Tails and
steered N.W. sail and Sails at 10 miles hauld to the
S.W. Boat reefed T and Mizen Tails and wore
Ship to the N.W. latter part set all sail heading
the same to end the day Lat 34° 16' Long 29° 10'

Thursday July 29th

Begins light winds from S.W. all sails set trying
to the N.W. at dusk calm Current the T and M
mizen yards at 2 A.M. took a fine breeze from
N.E. set all the standing and steered to latter
part a fresh breeze from N.W. to end the day
heading W by W by plenty Sulphur Bottoms Lat 34° 40'
Long 28° 03'

Friday July 30th

Begins a fresh breeze from W heading to the S.W.
at 4 double reefed the Tails at 6 miles hauld to
the S.W. wore ship and turned the Reefs out
of the Tails latter part a fine breeze
from N.E. Current W by W to end of day Lat 35° 07' Long 26° 03'

Saturday July 31st

Begins a fresh breeze from N.E. Current W by W
middle part the same latter part a hard Calm
to end the day the Current setting S.W.
and on hour to the S.W. Lat 35° 41' Long 25° 44'

Montpelier From Madagascar Towards St. Helena
Sunday July 1st

Begins light airs and Calm headed but set no
bottom at 130 Fathoms at 6 took a very light breeze from
S.E. set the standing sails and steered N.W. by W
from 7 untill Midnight Calm then took a fine
breeze from S.W. latter part the same saw a
Vessel steering to the North Lat 36° 06' Long 21° 56'

Monday August 2nd

Begins a fine breeze from S.E. Current W by W
all sail set at dusk mine hauld to the E
middle and latter parts from N.E. to end the
day hauld in light steering N.W. Lat 35° 41' Long 19° 14'

Tuesday August 3rd

Begins a light breeze from S.E. Current W by W
all sail set at dusk mine hauld to the S.W. about
begin the hump and to the W by W two sails in light middle and
latter parts from N.W. ship heading W to end
the nothing in sight Lat 36° 31' Long 14° 01'

Wednesday August 4th

Begins a moderate breeze from S.W. ship
heading W middle part a strong breeze double
reef the Tails latter part set whole Tails
and wore ship to the S.E. to end the day a
strong breeze and Rain squalls Lat 36° 46' Long 17° 03'

Thursday August 5th

Begins strong gales and squalls mine hauld
as usual ship heading to the S.E. at dusk set
whole Tails at 10 wore ship and set the
T Gallant sail heading S.W. at 3 A.M.
double reefed latter part Boat reefed and steered
the S.W. sail on Tails to end Lat 36° 36' Long 16° 13'

Friday August 6th

Begins a Gale from S.W. ship heading W under
Close reef Tails and Tails at 4 wore ship to the
N.E. at dusk more moderate set single reef Tails
and Tails set in the field to repair middle part
Squally and plenty of rain latter part repaired the Tails and set it
at noon a heavy squall with thunder and lightning and plenty of rain
to end under Boat sail heading N.W. Lat 35° 45' Long 17° 00'
