These 24 hours commenced with a strong breeze employed in
hoisting at 4 P.M. Lawrence and Chase a Whale without success
Latter part thick and rainy all hands employed in stowing oil
so ends the day 140 lbs

Wednesday May 17 1845

This day begins with fresh breeze from S.E. and cloudy
employed in stowing oil in the fore part of the
morning at 9 A.M. finished stowing so ends the day
Saw whales going quick to windward Lat 54.03

These twentyfour hours commenced fresh breeze
from S.E. and overcast weather at 2 P.M. saw
whales and loard and chast with out success
at 4 thick and rainy and took in sail Middle
and later part the same employed in repair
seven Boats

Friday the
Commenced with strong Breezes from S.E.
and warmer wether employed on the Boats middle
of the day from S.E. Latter part the wind shifted
to S.W. and moderated and set upper Reef topsail
so ends

Saturday the WJB Lat 54-20

Commenced with light wind from S.W. and
pleasant wether saw whales and loard and chase
with out success at 4 loard again with out success
at Dark took in sail Middle part thick fog light
air from N. at 7 A.M. cleared up and made sail
at 10 saw whale loard and struck and lost a long
so ends the day plenty of whales in sight

Sunday May 18

Commenced with light Breeze from S.W. and
at 4 P.M. saw a gam of whales loard and struck and
lost a line come a board and took in sail at
daylight made sail saw whales and loard 3 times
with out success so ends the day with several whales
in sight
