

Saturday June 10th 1843

Begins a strong breeze from S and current
thick weather saying S & E under short sail
at 1 P.M. set double reef T sails at 8
saw 2 Whales lowered 2 Boats without success
bore on beam and took in sail

At daylight thick foggy rain S & E
made sail and lay to the S. W.
At end the day thick foggy
employed in cleaning 2
ships in sight 2000

Sunday June 11 1843

Begins a fine breeze from S & E and the
boy steering to the S under short sail
2 ships in S steering southerly at 7 took
in sail and lay to the S during
the night latter part thick fog and
rain made no sail so ends down
no sail

Monday June 12 1843

Begins thick fog and rain
wind S & E at 3 P.M. later T and some
saw a Whale made sail at 5 thick
again took in sail middle the day
At daylight overcast, sunny weather took
sail ends over the day some fog and
rain saw 1 Whale lowered without success
2 ships in sight lot by the \$4.58

Tuesday June 13 1843

Begins a fresh breeze from E
and overcast thick weather stood out
dependent took whole T sails and
saw for a Whale without success
at 5 thick and rainy took in sail
Chilled and latter parts the same
so ends the day

Wednesday June 14 1843

Begins light winds from E with
thick fog and rain at 5 P.M. later the
ship Adela Lewis of Flavers 1800
latter parts calm and thick fog so ends
the Adela in sight

Thursday June 15 1843

Begins calm and thick fog middle part
the same at 6 A.M. cleared of made
sail at 8 saw and lowered for a
Whale without success at 10 lowered
for another and got a light from
at him soon drew back off so
ends the day 4 ships in sight

Lot by the \$4.40 long by Chron \$18.00
Friday May 16 1843

Begins light winds
from N & E and pleasant weather
ship standing to the N all sunset
at 4 lowered for a Whale going
quick to windward with an iron
and line attached to him without
success at 8 spoke the South Boston
Crown 160 ton and 2 W. Whales at
dark thick foggy double reefed and
stood S & E during the night at daylight
a strong breeze from N & E and some fog
set whole T sails and stood S & E but
the same nothing in sight so ends

Saturday June 17 1843

Begins a strong breeze from N & E and
foggy course 8 by 10 wind increasing double
reef and took in M sail and T
at dark took in sail and lay
by the way to the E at daylight again
breeze from S and pleasant set all sail at 9
saw a whale going quick to the N lowered
without success so ends light and calm
lot \$3.26 long by Chron 146.25
