

Sunday June 18th 1843

Begins calm and clear weather saw 1 fin back during the afternoon at dark took a light breeze from S.W. Sailed N.E. by all sail set chiddle port the same latter part some fog so ends the day Lat 52.43

Monday June 19th 1843

L.B. 130 Begins a fine breeze from S.W. and some fog. Saw and lowered for Whale but could not strike at 4 saw ~~two~~ another lowered struck and killed him at 4 set him along side took in sail and log by him during the night at 5 began to cut at noon finished made coil so ends the day a number of Whales in sight Lat 53.56

Tuesday June 20th 1843

L.B. Begins a fresh breeze from S.W. and thick at 1 P.M. lowered for a Gorm of 4 Whales but could not strike some on board and began to boil double reefed the 2 sails at 1 took in sail and log to the 1st at daylight made dail at 8 saw Whales lowered and struck to the L.B. whole crew very bad was obliged to cut so ends the day plenty of Whales in sight Lat 54.22

Wednesday June 21st 1843

L.B. Begins light air plenty of Whales employed in boiling at 1 P.M. lowered for a Gorm of 4 Whales struck to the L.B. and parted struck again to the W.B. and got slightly stove in under the ship and lost line got past again and parted whales took off gave up the chase at 6 lowered again for 2 Whales but could not strike at 9 spoke back Pioneer & Whales latter part fine weather a number Whales in sight lowered and 1 lowered and struck so ends 2 dails in sight Lat 54.13

Thursday June 22nd 1843

L.B. 110 Begins light air from W. and clear weather employed in boiling at 1 lowered for a Gorm of 4 Whales and struck to the W. Boat got the Whales down and lowered him to the ship at 6 got him aboard took in sail chiddle port calm employed in boiling latter part calm at 6 a.m. began to cut at noon finished so ends the day a number of Whales in sight and 2 Boats

Friday June 23rd 1843

Begins a light breeze from N.E. and overcast weather employed in boiling and stowing down at 8 P.M. blowing on close up the M.T. sail at midnight increased to a Gale with rain booted down and took in the S. sail latter part the same wind from N.W. so ends

Saturday June 24th 1843

Begins a Gale from N.W. and rain ship laying to the W. at 6 P.M. lowered for a Gorm of 4 Whales took in M.T. sail and 2 of 2 most stay sail at midnight and at 3 a.m. set the M.T. sail and began to boil so ends the day saw nothing to boil Lat 54.54

Sunday June 25th 1843

Begins a Gale from S.W. and moderating set the S. sail and wore ship to the W. S.W. all hands employed in stowing down and boiling at daylight fine weather made sail at 8 saw 2 Whales going quick to the S. did not lower at noon saw 2 more going the same did not lower so ends the day 4 sails in sight
