

Monday June 28th 1843

W 88 Begins a light breeze from E. and pleasant at employes in boiling at 5 lowered and struck a whale killed on a short time and the Iron Hook. Put to keep up on Luck at 7 spoke the Milton Lewis 6 Whales on this coast at 8 took in sail and lay to the I saw the I Watson took 2 Whales Middle port blew on to a gale with plenty of rain at midnight close reefed the M.T. sail and took in the I sail at 3 A.M. Cooked down the masts and took in the M.T. sail at 11 set the M.T. sail and began to boil again so ends the day 6 sails in sight

Tuesday June 29th 1843

Begins with the gale a moderate and some rain ship laying at N.E. under M. T. and I sail employed in boiling at 9 P.M. finished boiling middle port thick and rainy at daylight thick fog broke out the Iron hook and went to stowing down ends the same light airs from N.W. and fog and rain

Wednesday June 30th 1843

Wind 110. Begins light airs from N.W. and thick fog employed in stowing down oil at 8 finished Middle and latter port strong breezes with Rain and fog so ends the day

Thursday June 29th 1843

Begins a strong breeze from W. with fog and rain ship laying to the S. under short sail Middle port lay to the N.E. at daylight made sail with a light breeze from W. at 6 A.M. saw a dead whale went to him found he was not good ends foggy & dark in sight

Friday June 30th 1843

Begins a light breeze from the S. and thick fog ship laying to the N.E. all sail set at daylight double reefed the I sails and struck N. and I at midnight blow on and shifted to N.E. Lay to the N.E. latter blow on to a gale took in the M.T. sails so ends the day laying to the S. 2 sails in sight set 54.56

Saturday July 1st 1843

Begins a gale from N.E. and some rain ship laying to the S. under short sail at 6 P.M. took in the I sail Middle port the same latter port moderate and thick fog so ends the day employed in starting Breeze into Breeze the Olds

Sunday July 2nd 1843

130 70 80 Begins a light breeze from N. and foggy at 3 P.M. clear pleasant weather saw a dead whale took him along side and cut him in at 9 spoke the Gales having got 4 Whales since we saw her Middle port employed in boiling at 8 lowered and struck and killed a whale having a part of a bone in his small took him a long side and commenced cutting so ends the day blowing in strong

Monday July 3rd 1843

Begins a strong breeze from N.W. and foggy employed in cutting at 4 P.M. finished saw 5 ships during the afternoon all attending to the M.T. Middle and latter port employed in boiling at 9 A.M. spoke the ship Milton and the Bannin Whitehead at Bedford 2 60 Sprm and 3 W. 80 Whales ends fine weather the M. and B. in company set 54.56

Tuesday July 4th

Steved down 70 lbs. Begins a fine breeze from W. and some fog ship standing at N.E. M. and B. in company employed in boiling at dark took in sail and lay to the S. at midnight some ship to the S. latter port light airs from the S. and clear the chills in company so ends the day celebrated the day with a salute of 6 guns set 55.00
