Shells Middle part Calm at 7 a.m. took a Light breeze
from NW steamed & by 8 had the same but not by
Monday August 14 - 1843

Begins' calm mid W. port a light breeze from W. Course S by E. Latter part employed in crossing. Tine sent up 1 sheet studding sail. Breeze down and lowered for Blackfish without success. So end light air from S by W ship lying & 4. Lat 51° 45' N. Long 137° 38' W.

Tuesday August 15 - 1843

90  BB Begins Light airs from W. Lovers
July 9. all sail set ~~at~~ ^{for} employment in Closing
Bore chills and light airs from N. Several Whales spouting and
called W. Whales at 6 A.M. saw plenty of Finbacks and 1 W. Whale
Lovers struck and killed him at 11 got him to the ship so ends this
day 1 W. Whale Finbacks and plenty of Black fish in sight

Wednesday August 18th 1863

90 SB Begins light airs from NE and fine weather commenced. Cutting at 4 PM finished bread sail and began to sail at 8 took in the light sails ship lying up & at 9 tacked to the 8th middle part the same at 6 PM. Saw a Whale Luvard and Chained on the west side at 11 saw another Luvard and struck do ends. Bouts fast

 so Ends employed in setting up Pipes, Bundling Bone &
 Boiling Lost by Vels 49.05

Friday August 18th 1843

Begins a fresh breeze from the N^W & E^N
this Evening to the S^E & E^N under short sail employed in
letting up Poles and Boiling Middle part pleasant to hear
a fresh breeze from E & some squalls so ends - saw
nothing employe in Boiling and letting up Poles

Begins a fresh breeze from E with
Fog & Rain this Morn'g to the 1st under M T sail & 7th
sail employed in Boiling & setting up Pipes at 8th h
Move ship to the 7th Middle part the storm with
some rain to End Latter part made no sail employed
in Boiling and Stowing down Oil do Ends Saw & Timber
Lost by Vls 48.47 Lany by Storm 137.48 7th 11
