

Ship Montpelier New Bedford
Tuesday April the 14th

First part of these 24 hours fine pleasant weather and a brisk breeze at S at sunset shortened sail luffed to headed to the Eastward at daylight made all sail and steered N W E saw nothing at midday more ship & steered Eastward thus ends the day Lat 18.06 Long 116.02 E

Wednesday April the 15th

Commences with fine pleasant weather and a brisk breeze at S at sunset shortened sail headed to the Eastward at daylight made all sail and steered to the Eastward Latter part light airs thus ends Lat 17.06 Long 117.19 E

Thursday April the 16th

Commences with fine weather and light airs at S at 4 P.M. saw a school of Black fish below the boats but did not strike at sunset shortened sail Middle part the wind hauled to the Eastward Latter part a strong breeze took one reef in the topsails, headed to the N E at midday more ship and steered to the S saw nothing thus ends Lat 17.12 Long 117.20 E

Friday April the 17th

First part of these 24 hours a strong breeze at E at sunset took in sail at daylight made all sail and steered to the W E thus ends Lat 17.34 Long 116.52 E

Saturday April the 18th

Commences with fine pleasant weather and small breezes at Eastward at sunset shortened sail at daylight made all sail Latter part a brisk breeze at S headed W S W saw nothing thus ends Lat 17.41 Long 115.45 E

Sunday April the 19th

Commences with fine weather and a brisk breeze at S at sunset shortened sail Middle & Latter part light airs and calm saw nothing thus ends Lat 17.49 N E Obs Long 115.35

Monday April the 20th

First part of these 24 hours calm Middle part light airs at Eastward Latter part a strong breeze at S E headed S S W saw a school of Black Fish thus ends Lat 17.50 Long 114.42 E

Tuesday April the 21st

Commences with fine weather and a brisk breeze at S E Middle and Latter part the same saw several fin backs saw 2 ships to windward and a cutting thus ends 18.43 Long 114.25

Wednesday April the 22nd

Commences with fine weather and a brisk breeze at S E at sunset took in sail and spoke with the Ship William, Baker, Capt Boyer, Tonnage 1,600 tbs the Ship to me saw cutting proceed to be the Paladium, at daylight made all sail, headed to the S W the to same ships in sight, thus ends Lat 19.08 Long 113.40 E
