

Ship Montpelier New Bedford April 23¹⁹
Thursday April the 23rd 1840

Commences with fine weather
and a moderate breeze at 5 P.M. spoke ship
Palladium & printed New London 17,00 bls 160 S.
sailing to Bremen Whales, at sunset shortened sail
at daylight made all sail headed S.W. saw nothing
thus ends. Lat 19,11 N. Obs Long 113,35.

Friday April the 24th

Commences with fine weather
and a brisk breeze at 5 P.M. spoke ship Draper
Howland New Bedford 900 bls 120 S. at sunset
shortened sail, at daylight made all sail headed to the
South saw several finbacks, thus ends Lat 19,33 Long 112,58

Saturday April the 25th

Commences with fine weather
and a light breeze at E at sunset shortened sail headed
to the Southward at daylight made all sail employed
in repairing the main top sail saw nothing thus
ends the day. Lat 20,18 Long 112,31 E

Sunday April the 26th

Commences with fine weather
and a moderate breeze at Eastward at sunset shortened
sail Middle and latter part much the same, at daylight
made all sail headed to Southward saw nothing
thus ends the day. Lat 21,16 Long 112,38 E

Monday April the 27th

Commences with fine weather and
a brisk breeze at S.E. headed to the S. saw to fin
backs Middle and latter part much the same one
ship in sight, thus ends, Lat 22,07 Long 111,13 E

Ship Montpelier
Tuesday April the 28th

Commences with fine weather
and a brisk breeze at S.E. headed S.W. at 5 P.M.
spoke the ship Clifford Thome, Downes Fairbairn with
17,00 bls, spoke oil at sunset shortened sail at daylight
made sail headed to the S. so ends, Lat 22,27 Long 110,46

Wednesday April the 29th

Commences with fine weather
and light breeze at E headed to the S. at sunset shortened
sail at 10. Commences with many sharp lightning
bells all hands and took in all sail but it proved to be nothing
at daylight made sail headed to the S. saw to ships standing
to the North East so ends Lat 23,00 Long 110,30 E

Thursday April the 30th

Commences with fine weather and a
strong breeze at E headed to the S. at sunset shortened sail
at daylight made all sail, 3 ships in sight latter part
light airs, so ends Lat 23,26 Long 110,25 E

Friday May the 1st 1840

Commences with fine weather
and a light breeze at E at 3 P.M. spoke 2 ships the
Delphos 12,00 bls 120 S and North Anarcick 4,50 bls
3,00 S at sunset shortened sail at daylight made all
the same to ships in sight so ends Lat 23,18 Long 110,24

Saturday May the 2nd

Commences with fine weather and
a light breeze at E headed to the E at sunset shortened sail
Middle and latter part light airs and calm at daylight
made all sail, one sail in sight, employed in ships
distress thus ends, Lat 23,40 N. Obs
