and a heavy smell employed in cutting the whale at 4
P.M. finished cutting, cleared the decks and commenced
boiling at daylight main sail, 2 Ships in sight. Latter part
light airs and calm employed in boiling sounds Lat 23.45
Long 116.00

Thursday May the 14th

Commenced with light airs and
calm at sunset shortened sail at daylight main sail and
saw several Sperm Whales, lowered and struck a Whale
At midday took the Whale a long side ends light airs
and calm No. 18

Friday May the 15th

Commenced with fine weather
light airs and calm employed in cutting 2 Ships
in sight one got a Whale At daylight saw Whales lowered
and struck 10 Whales At 10 A.M. took them a long side
Commenced cutting, 10 Ships in sight ends light airs
and calm Lat 23.49 No. 18

Saturday May the 16th

Commenced with fine weather employed
cutting ends much the same several ships in sight
Lat 23.45 No. 18

weather All these 24 hours fine pleasant
first part employed in cutting and boiling, latter
stowing down so ends Lat 23.30

Monday May the 18th

All these 24 hours fine weather employed in boiling
and stowing down several Ships in sight, ends Lat 23.30

Tuesday May the 19th

Commenced with fresh breeze at S E
employed in boiling latter part the same several
Ships in sight so ends Lat 23.40 No. 18

Wednesday May the 20th

All these 24 hours fine weather, first
part employed boiling latter part stowing down
so ends Lat 23.49 Long 116.45

Thursday May the 21st

All these 24 hours strong breeze at
S E, employed in stowing down At 4 P.M. saw
Sperm Whales, lowered but did not get first sounds, Lat
23.38

Friday May the 22nd

All these 24 hours fresh breeze and pleasant
weather employed in stowing down and cleaning Ships
several Ships in sight so ends Lat 23.30 Long 116.35

Saturday May the 23rd

All these 24 hours fine pleasant weather
in a fresh breeze at S E At 7 P.M. spoke Ship Mary Richardson
of Redford, 80 blbs so ends Lat 24.10 Long 116.11 E

Sunday May the 24th

All these 24 hours fine pleasant weather and light
airs at S E, 3 Ships in sight so ends Lat 24.33 Long 116.11 E
