Saturday June the 6th

Commences with a strong breeze at S W and squally weather at 2 P.M. spoke barque Hannest Fisher Fairhaven 600 bls. at 3 P.M. spoke Ship Brighton Menman New Bedford 800 bls. Middle and latter part much the same the same to ship in sight thus ends Lat 23.41 No Obs

Sunday June the 7th

Commences with a strong breeze at S E and squally weather at 1 P.M. saw the same to ships chasing Whales and saw the barque take a Whale a long side. saw the whales going quick to the Windward the Brighton gave up the chase Middle and latter part much the same and sail in sight thus ends Lat 23.56 No Obs

Monday June the 8th

Commences with moderate breezes and squally weather saw several finbacks latter part fine weather to ships in sight so ends Lat 23.51 Long 107.30

Tuesday June the 9th

Commences with fine weather and a moderate breeze at S E Middle and latter part much the same to ships in sight at Meridian saw a Ship take a Whale alongside thus ends Lat 24.00

Wednesday June the 10th

Commences with a strong breeze at S E at 2 P.M. saw a Spinn Whale lowered and struck and drew 6 Ships in sight at sunset spoke Ship Bruns Wick Manchester Providence 1000 bls. latter part much the same Lat 24.30

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Thursday June the 11th

Commences with fine weather and a moderate breeze at E headed to N Middle and latter part much the same, saw several finbacks, 4 Ships in sight saw one Culling. so ends Lat 24.14 No Obs

Friday June the 12th

Commences with fine pleasant weather and light airs at S E Middle and latter part the same at sunset spoke with 4 Ships, the Lucy Ann 1000 bls the North America 500 bls, the Bruns Wick 1100 bls the Lemnidas 170 bls thus ends Lat 24.02

Saturday June the 13th

Commences with fine weather and light airs Middle part the same latter part a strong breeze at S E headed to the S E Ships in sight so ends Lat 23.58

Sunday June the 14th

Commences with a strong breeze at S E headed to the N at sunset spoke Ship Dissourney of London 70 bls; Middle and latter part much the same headed to the S thus ends the day Lat 23.56 No Obs

Monday June the 15th

All these 24 hours fine pleasant weather and light airs at S E; 3 Ships in sight at 4 P.M. spoke the Friend Ship Taber Fairhaven 1500 bls 400 bls spoken headed to the N thus ends Lat 23.46 No Obs

Tuesday June the 16th

Commences with fine weather and light airs at S E; Middle and latter part much the same, 3 Ships in sight, thus ends Lat 24.14 No Obs
